nation of Tarzans. There is one other thing though. Many of the men (one out of every three) rejected as 4-F by the army will be inconvenienced by poor health all through their lifetime due to ;paysical inadequacies brought on by lack of proper development in their younger years.

Schools in this county have physical training for all students. It is carried out similar to other classes, with a short period each day devoted to bodily development. Only those engaged in competitive sports such as football, basket ball and track really devote long hours to strenuous exercise.

Whether or not the Texas school systems will eventually cut out altogether the program of mass participation in athletics will remain speculation. In Texas, where the population is not concentrated in the large cities, we have yet to reach the danger point for the majority of our people. As a general rule, young men in the service from states west of the Mississippi prove themselves capable of more physical strain than their friends from the large cities of the east. In this area, where the economical emphasis is on farming, there is more physical labor taking place and consequently better genera physical conditions. But the time has come for our

school executives on a state level to consider extending the require ments for physical education. If a youngster leaves high school strong and healthy, he has a better chance of remaining that way the rest of his life. There are arguments both pro and con as how to best spend our limited school time -on physical fitness or on mental training. Naturally a balance should be achieved, but from available statistics, it would appear that the nation as a whole has underemphasized physical training.
