



New Fishing Law **Explained Again**

AUSTIN, Reported misunderstanding of the statewide fishing law prompted the Executive Secretary of the Game, Fish and Oyster - Commission to restate some of the principal provisions Saturday.

The law, passed by the last regular legislative session to replace many conflicting local statues, permits persons to fish without a license in their home counties and to fish in streams separating the county of their residence and adjacent counties unless they use artificial bait. Fresh water fishermen who use artificial bait are required to have a license regardless of

The act also permits Texans to fish in counties adjoining their home counties without a bait or use live bait. Licenses are required of persons fishing

There also has been some misinderstanding about the trespasing law which was amended by the last regular legislative session. The new changes, according to the Executive Secretary, stipulate that game wardens now have the authority to make arrests for trespassing, and also provides for an increased penalty for viola-


