\$200,000 Federal Money for Terrell County Roads

County Judge Henshaw has received word from Austin that out of the money appropriated by the Federal Government for the building of good roads in Texas, the sum of \$200,000, has been allotted to Terrell county.

This, indeed, is good news and every one will rejoice over it. Our citizens, as a whole, have long looked forward to the day when Terrell county would be traversed by good roads, and

now their dream is to be realized.

It is only a question of time now when work will begin on the Robert E. Lee Highway in Terrell county. The \$250,000 worth of road bonds recently issued by this county, have been advertised for sale, and judging from the many inquiries received in regard to the bonds, there will be some lively bidding on them. The Commissioners Court will meet today for the purpose of receiving and considering bids.

Will Play at Langtry July 4th

The "Pale-faces" will go to Langtry July 4th, where they are scheduled to play a game with the Langtry "Invincibles." The Sanderson boys will go down to the little city by the Pecos with the determination to put up one of the best games they are capable of, for they know that the Langtry team is a strong one and it will take good playing to beat them.
