



The attorney general's department Monday approved an issue of building, erection and equipment bonds, amounting to \$2,000,000, of the San Antonio independent school district. The bonds are payable serially and bear 5 per cent interest.

### **COTTON ADVANCES ACCOUNT HOT WINDS**

Unfavorable News From Abroad Causes Moderate Declines.

New Orleans.-Unfavorable foreign news caused moderate declines in the cotton market in the early part of this last week, after which complaints that the hot winds in portions of Texas resulted in strong recoveries and small net advances. Toward the end of the week, private reports told of a considerable volume of ginning of new cotton being done in the earliest portions of Texas and the market fell off again, the close being 10 points under to four points over the close of the preceding week. At the highest the list showed net gains of 15 to 38 points while at the lowest it stood at net losses of 57 to 73 points. October sold off to 21.28, came back to 22.31, and closed at 21.92. In the spot department middling closed net, unchanged, at 22.60 cents a pound, which price compared with 11.88 on the close of this week last year.

Labor conditions in this country were against prices for awhile, as was also the weakness in foreign exchange, but later in the week such features were balanced by reduction in Bank of England rate to 3 per cent. During the greater part of the week, it was altogether a weather market and at the time when Texas was sending out complaints of hot winds trading became very heavy with shorts covering in a large way. This sort of buying helped to carry the market to its highest levels.

After the middle of the week temperatures were somewhat lower in the western belt and reports of much cotton being ginned attracted much attention, especially as it was claimed the ginning would increase in the near

Texas 2nd Among Rice-Growing States Texas stands second in total acreage among rice growing states of the United States with 175,246 acres this year, according to figures compiled by P. H. Wilson, vice president of the Seaboard Rice Milling Company. Louisiana leads with 554,402 acres, while Arkansas is third with 152,374. Out of a total acreage of 1,040,922 in the entire country, these states account for 882,022 acres. This year's acreage indicates that planters are again turning to rice growing after the sharp decline caused by low prices and other conditions in 1921. The total acreage in the United States in 1921 was only 914.436, compared with 1,373,163 the year before. This ratio is carried out by the three leading states, which had 747,566 acres of rice in 1921 and 1,-198,338 in 1920. The Blue Rose type is the most favored, the percentage planted to that type this year being 60.07 for the nation and 70.87 for the
