MILLIONS FOR GOOD ROADS THIS YEAR

To Be Brought About By the Continuation of Federal Aid.

Washington.-Approximately \$100,-000,000 will be spent for good road construction throughout the country during the fiscal year beginning July 1. This will be brought about by the continuation of federal aid for roads under recent authorization of an appropriation among the several states.

propriation bill signed by President Harding June 18, authorized appropriation of \$65,000,000 for the same purpose, to be expended during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1923, and \$75,-000,000 for the succeeding fiscal year. The conditions are the same for all three years, and will bring the total amount expended during the period, if the states adhere to the stipulations and expend like sums, to \$380,000,000. The funds will be administered by the secretary of agriculture through the Bureau of Good Roads.

Otherwise, the federal funds for new projects will be withheld.

Plans for the proposed system have already been received by the Bureau of Good Roads from all by eight states, and the state systems are being coordinated so that when joined together they will serve the best interests of the whole country. In the mean-

No More Mexicans to

Washington.-The department of labor has refused to waive the immigration regulations for so-called temporary admission of Mexican labor for several producing seasons past, as reas. In a letter to Senator Sheppard this week the department said the head tax, illiteracy and contract labor features of the law would be enforced to Texas and other states along the Mexican border, as well as the remainder of the country.

During and following the war the immigration law was waived as to admission of Mexicans for temporary The waiver was continued after the war on showing that labor was not available in the Mexican border region. The admissions were good only for six months, after which the allen

was to be returned to Mexico. Reports of the department of labor reveal that the Mexicans remained here in large numbers and complaints competing with the labor in industry. The seasonable supply of labor in Southern Texas for agricultural purses is reported here to be a probem of practically every year. Some of the planters testified before congressional committees that when they could not get labor already in the United States they resorted to "wetacks," which was the term applied to Mexicans who had waded the Rio Grande without being detected by the umigration officials.
