



Hunting Regulations for Other Game, Bag Limits, Etc., Are Given.

Austin, Tex.-Doves may be hunted Sept. 1. at the opening of dove-hunting season in Texas and State Game Commissioner W. W. Boyd, who has recently returned from extended inspections of the state, reports a gratitring number of them to hunt.

Residents of the state have to pay \$2 for a license and out of the state esidents \$15. Any person can hunt in the county in which he lives without license, but in no other county. Licenses purchased now are good

antil September 1, 1923. Doves are the first game the hunters can shoot in September, the open December 15. The bag limit on doves

for one day is 15. Directions for hunters in regard to 'heir bag limits follows: "Three buck deer during the sea-

ion from November 1 to December 31, nclusive, each year. "Three wild turkey gobblers dur-

ing the season, from November 1st to December 31st, inclusive, each year. "Fifteen doves in one day, from September 1st to December 15th, inclus-

"Fifteen quail and Mexican pheasants (known as "Chacalaca") in one iay. December 1st to January 31st. Twenty-five ducks in one day, from October 16th to January 31st.

"Twenty-five snipe per day, from October 16th to January 31st. "Eight geese per day, from October

6th to January 31st. "Eight brant per day, from October 6th to January 31st. "You are not allowed to kill more han an aggregate of twenty-five in eny one day of ducks, geese, brant,

plovers, snipe or shore-birds. "You are not allowed to kill at any ime of the year any antelope, mounain sheep, prairie chickens, pheasints (except Chacalaca), wood-cock or

"You may kill rabbits, hawks, crows, ouzzards, owls, English sparrows, ricepirds and black-birds in any number and all seasons. "You must not buy, sell or barter

any wild game or game birds "You must not catch, kill or have in your possession nor shi; at any one time more than the aggregate of seventy-five ducks, geese, brant and

You must not kill a turkey hen at "You must not kill any doe or spot-

ed fawn at any time. "You must not catch, kill or have in

your possession any wild song birds. You must not hunt any wild game or wild game birds at night with any kind of light or lantern.

"It is unlawful to hunt in any couny other than the one in which you retide without a license.

"Resident license, \$2.00 enables you to hunt anywhere in the state.

"Non-resident licenses, \$15.00. "All express agents and all conducters and auditors of trains and all capains of boats or persons in charge of he navigation of boats are hereby empowered to administer oaths necessary to the shipment of game, and for administering such oaths, they are hereby authorized to collect twenty-five cents from the persons making such paths.


