MAX LUCKIE SHOT DIES INSTANTLY

Word reached here late Tuesday evening to the effect that Max Luckie of Dryden had been seriously shot and immediately left for that city. However he died before medical aid could get there. Sheriff Joe Nance and deputy Lee Cook left immediately for the scene of the shooting, and met L. A. Henning, deputy sheriff of Dryden, on his way here with George (Tinker) Rutledge, who following the shooting surrendered to the officer.

The examining trial and inquest was held Wednesday and Rutledge was placed under a \$4,000 bond which he made. Mr. Luckie's body was brought to Sanderson early Wednesday morning to be prepared for burial. His father, brother and a nephew came over from Sonora and returned with the remains where burial took place in that city. Mr. Luckie has been ranching in the country south of Dryden for a number of years. Surviving him are his widow, four children and numerous relatives who reside in Sonora.

FREIGHT TRAIN HITS MAN IN TRUCK

Last Monday morning as A. B. Chambers was crossing the tracks at Dryden, in a truck, an east-bound freight train hit the front of his truck turning it around hitting the rear, and the car turned over pinning Mr. Chambers under it. Mr. Chambers stated that box cars standing on the siding tracks prevented him from seeing the freight coming. He was carried into El Paso Monday evening on passenger train No. 101 as he was badly bruised about the shoulders, arms and chest, and the last reports from him state that he is doing well.

Cold Wave Hits Sanderson.

With rainfall in Sanderson and Terrell County breaking a March record in many, many years, one of the coldest spells gripped Sanderson and vicinity late Monday and continued throughout Tuesday. Shortly after midnight sleet began to fall, causing the thermometer to take a considerable drop. All Tuesday a cold, high wind blew, causing many people to put up their stoves that had been taken down, and to get out their winter clothing which had been stored away. As far as can be learned none of the ranchers suffered any loss among their stock. Wednesday the weather had moderated.

RATTLE OF THE RAIL.

Work has been started on making extensive repairs to the roundhouse and putting in a new 100 foot turntable to take care of the large power. Fireman S. B. Newcomb has been assigned to a freight run out of here. The railroad boys are highly elated over the new passenger run going on which will add six engine crews to the runs between El Paso and Valentine, and the same number of train crews between El Paso and San Antonio, which will correspondingly give that much more work to the freight men down the line. C. H. Morris visited Del Rio Sunday. Engineer O. S. Blanton and Fireman C. C. Crownover have been selected to go to the Fuel Convention to be held in Chicago in the near future, for their efforts in fuel saving.

WILLIAMS SPUDS IN ON NEW TEST.

The E. T. Williams test, 13 miles southeast of the city, on the Sanderson anticline, was spudded in last Sunday with a large crowd of local people on hand to witness it. This test starts in the Edwards lime, and they expect to hit the Pennsylvanian at 800 feet. The geology of the district was worked out by W. R. Calvert, formerly geologist with the U. S. Geological Survey. The test is planned to go to at least 3,000 feet.

Hon. Claude B. Hudspeth was a business visitor in the city Friday. While here he gave a contract Shirley Martin to build a ranch home on his ranch he recently purchased from Prosser and Brown. 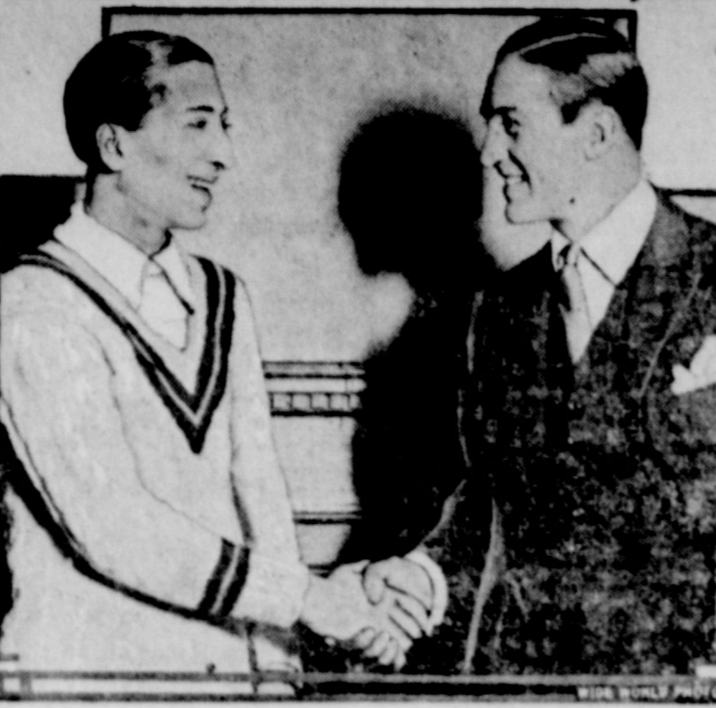

Potential World's Tennis Champion

Framed in the background of France's sensational though losing fight to topple America from the international tennis pinnacle, Rene Lacoste stands forth as a potential world's champion, if not already within the realm of consideration for the honor held so long by William T. Tilden.

Critics are of the opinion that Lacoste's straight-set victories over Tilden and Vincent Richards may be accepted as indicating that the twenty-two-year-old Wimbledon champion has earned a place as outstanding contender for international No. 1 ranking.

Victories Amazing

Lacoste's victories over the No. 1 and No. 2 players were amazing in the ease and decisiveness with which he won, particularly in view of the fact that he never had played on the courts. It was believed that the strangeness of playing on the boards, together with the peculiar lighting conditions, would bother him.

Lacoste has gone back to the tennis of 15 and 20 years ago to build a foundation for his game. Although he has adopted the fast, American twist ball and although he makes occasional sallies to the forecourt, he has conquered mainly from the baseline, where such modern stars as Watson Washburn and Nathaniel W. Niles faltered within reach of national crowns.

The French star's offensive, the antithesis of that of his compatriot, Borotra, is almost colorless in its precision of stroke. Tilden with his curved ball service, Richards with his volleys, Johnston with his great forehand drive, Williams, Murray and McLaughlin with violent net assaults, swept all before them by the sheer power of their brilliant attacks. Lacoste has sounded a note of defiance to the modern tennis trend. And in his cool, deliberate, almost effortless way, he has succeeded where success seemed almost beyond attainment.

Cobb Will Equal Another Record in 1926 Season

One of the few outstanding records of major-league baseball which are not in the trophy room of Tyrus Raymond Cobb is almost within his grasp—the greatest number of years in baseball. The 22-year record of the late Adrian C. ("Pop") Anson will be equaled when the Georgia Peach steps out on the diamond this season. Anson was virtually benched after his 22 years in major-league baseball. Last year Cobb caught up with Honus Wagner of the Pittsburgh Pirates, who completed 21 years in baseball before retiring. Cobb is now thirty-nine years old, but the lack of speed which brought about the retirement of Wagner and Anson is not indicated in Cobb's 1925 mark of 97 tallies for his team.

In battling Cobb's record exceeds that of Anson. In 21 years Cobb has gathered 3,823 hits in 10,353 times at bat, while Anson made 3,581 hits in 9,084 times at bat, Cobb's lifetime average being .369 to Anson's .336.

Uncle Robby in Need of Some Batting Support

Are the old boys there? See what Uncle Robby did and read your answer. In 1902 he made nine hits one June afternoon and the Baltimore Sun said: "Robinson surpassed all previous records in batting this season. In the first game he came seven times to bat and made seven base hits, with a total of eight bases. In the second game he said his 'tamps' were a little tired and he made two hits out of five times up."

"How come?" Uncle Robby was asked the other day. "You were on nine times and scored only twice."

"Didn't have anybody to bat me in," came the answer.

Remarkable Record



Thomas Hinton, captain of the University of Kansas Rifle team, fired a score of 308 out of a possible 400 in the college match with the University of Missouri team. He fired 100 prone, 100 sitting, 100 kneeling, and 98 standing. His feat gives him the new indoor intercollegiate rifle-shooting record.

Suzanne Lenglen's apparent dread of the day when she will be defeated by some younger rival is shared by most champions in the rigorous game of life.

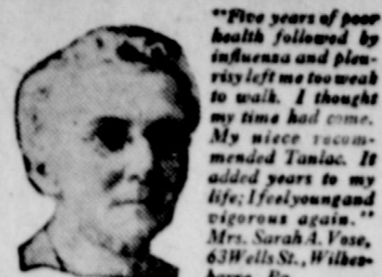
