Games and dancing were enjoyed until a late hour.

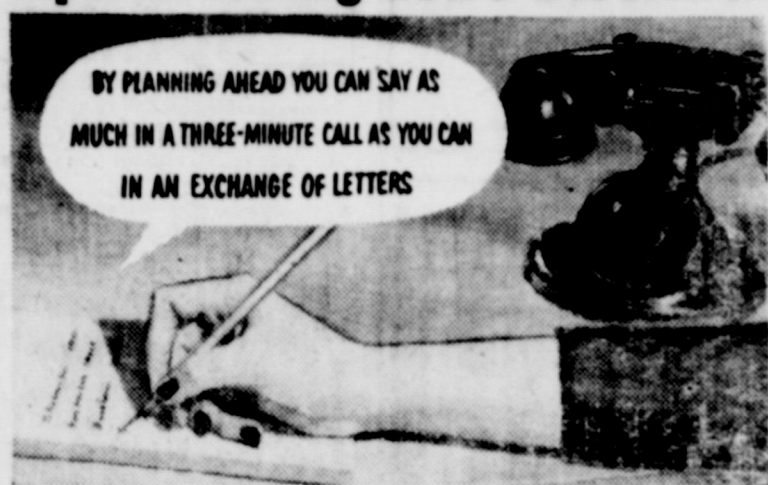

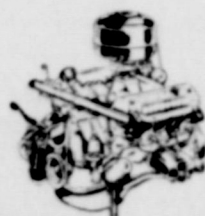

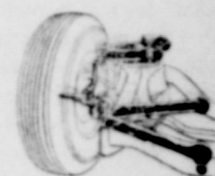
