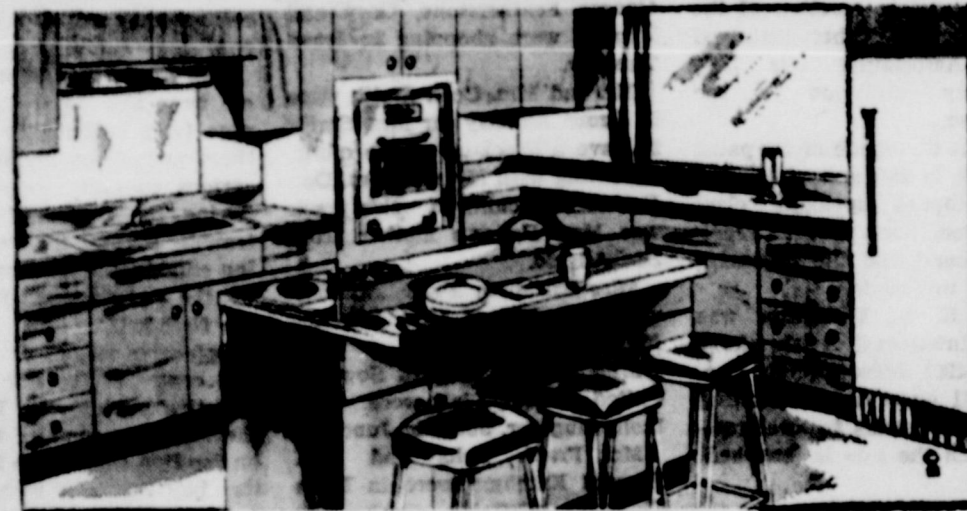

**Capt. James Abijah Brooks**  
Ranger  
" . . . got him and I chained him up . . . "

Baton, Texas, was a-bowl with a 3-way brangle involving stockmen, oilfield workers and the local law. A wild gas well had been fired to stop the destruction of cattle. Tempers flared, guns fired . . . then a killing. So a Ranger, Captain James A. Brooks, was sent in to calm things down. He reported considerable turbulence, and headquarters offered reinforcements. Captain Brooks' brief and only acknowledgment: "Got the killer and I chained him up." . . . Brooks had been a rancher and trail driver until 1882, when he joined the Rangers for almost a quarter century of active service. Very active . . . such as, in 1896, rearranging the planned prizefight between Bob Fitzsimmons and Pete Maher in El Paso, and dealing misery to the cattle thieves who plagued the King Ranch in 1902. In later years Brooks added to his stature in the State Legislature and as County Judge of Brooks County, named for him.
