



USDA to Reopen all FSA Offices for Most Services During Government Shutdown

All Farm Service Agency (FSA) service centers will be open beginning January 24 to provide the majority of FSA services needed by farmers and ranchers during this critical time of the year for agricultural operations. Additionally, the limited FSA loan services initially made available at certain FSA county offices beginning January 17 will continue January 22 and 23.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has recalled more than 9,700 FSA employees to keep offices open from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. weekdays beginning January 24. For the first two full weeks under

this operating plan (January 28 through February 1 and February 4 through February 8), FSA offices will be open Mondays through Fridays. In subsequent weeks, offices will be open three days a week, on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays.

Agricultural producers who have business with the agency should contact their FSA service center to make an appointment. The deadline to apply and complete applications for the Market Facilitation Program has been extended to February 14. Other program deadlines may be modified and will be announced shortly.

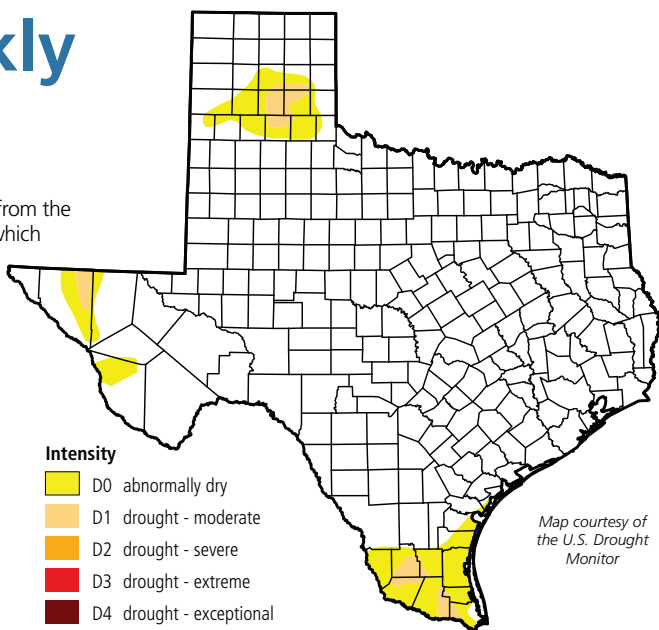
Water conditions

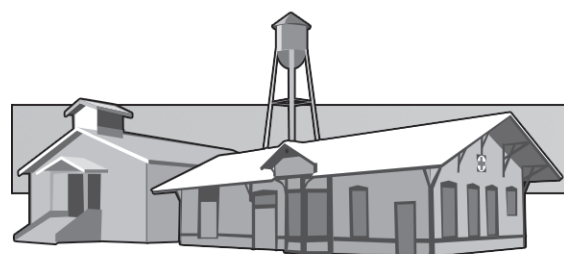

FRIONA FLASHBACKS

From the Friona Star Archives

January 22, 2015:

The Hospital District board of directors voted to proceed with plans to take over the ownership and management of Prairie Acres Nursing Home and Friona Heritage Estates assisted living facility. Prairie Acres and Heritage Estates have always been owned by the City of Friona. For several years the city has wanted to divest itself of the two facilities. Talks have been ongoing with the hospital district to assume management and operation of the properties.

The hospital district board held a joint meeting with the Muleshoe Hospital board Monday January 12. Preferred Management, the company that operates Parmer Medical Center and the Friona Rural Health Clinic, has recently also leased the Muleshoe Hospital. The purpose of the joint meeting was to seek management services for the communities' nursing homes. Discussions were held to contract with Oklahoma based nursing home management company Diakonos Group once control has been transferred to the hospital district. Hospital District board president Danny Kendrick said the primary goal for taking over Prairie Acres and Heritage Estates is to assure that the long-term care facilities remain open and continue to provide excellent Care and service to the citizens of Friona and Parmer County. Kendrick said the board estimates it will take about six months to work out the legal details and due diligence required to complete the takeover.

January 27, 2005:

The Farmer County spelling bee will be held Wednesday February 9 at 9 .m. in the Friona junior high auditorium. The top three winners from junior and senior bees in Farwell, Lazbuddie, Bovina, and Friona are eligible to participate. The county bee winner will advance to the regional spelling bee at Canyon High School March 5. Friona's spelling bee, for students in the 6th, 7th, and 8th grades, is scheduled for February 3 at 3 p.m. in the junior high auditorium. Bovina's middle school bee is tentatively set for February 3. Bovina and Friona elementary schools have decided not to hold a junior bee this year

January 4, 1997

On Monday, January 6, a vehicle was re-

ported as stolen to the Friona Police Department. Officer, Manny Torres spotted and attempted to stop the vehicle near the intersection of White and Elm Streets. The driver exited the car and fled on foot. Officer Torres chased the suspect to a nearby residence where a struggle ensued. Torres was joined by Captain Tim Roberts to assist in subduing the suspect. During the struggle, Officer Torres sustained a cut to his hand from a broken glass coffee table and minor injuries to the suspect. The subject was arrested after the struggle. Both the officer and the suspect were taken to Parmer County Hospital for treatment, where Officer Torres required twelve stitches to his hand.

January 17, 1987

The Friona area was hit by a winter storm which began Thursday, bringing snow and some of the coldest temperatures of the year to the area. After experiencing spring-like temperatures during the first part of the week, when high readings flirted with the 70-degree mark, the mercury began to fall on Wednesday as a Pacific front cleared the way for the approaching Arctic mass. Thursday's high temperature was only 32 degrees, and residents awoke on Friday to a low reading of 15 degrees, with about three inches of snow. The snow was hard to measure, due to the brisk north wind that blew steadily. About two inches were received in the local area. With the wind, Amarillo's weather bureau had calculated the chill factor at -20 degrees early Friday. Local schools were winding up their semester tests, and held classes on schedule on Friday. However, Monday will be a holiday, since it is a teacher work day. The latest snowfall once again called a halt to the extended cotton and sugar beet harvest.

January 13, 1972

Construction totals for the city of Friona came to \$569,000 for the calendar year of 1971, according to a tally of building permits Issued by the city office. The total was, as expected, lower than that for 1970, which was near an all-time record at \$1,956,975. However, the figures for 1970 included the 60- unit apartment complex, as well as the new Friona State Bank building--well over \$1 million between them. New residences once again led the way In the current totals, with 28

permits Issued for construction valued at an estimated \$478,200 In 1970, there were 43 new residences started, at an estimated cost of \$626,400 A total of 63 permits were issued the past calendar year, nine less than the previous year In other breakdowns, there were four permits for commercial buildings. These Included the new Chevron Station under construction on West Highway 60: Campbell's Pit Bar-B-Que business on last Highway 60: the Crowe-Guide Cement Company, and the car wash in conjunction with Kerr Mobil. There were 32 permits Issued for additions or alterations, worth an estimated \$48,450 This was an Increase from the former year' s totals of 25 permits and \$27,575. Although the totals for 1971 failed for the first time in four years to top the million-dollar mark, they were still considered as "healthy" by City Manager Jake Outland, particularly In light of the tight-money situation which has existed on a nationwide scale. Building totals for the City of Friona for the past four years stand at \$4,601,075. During that period, a total of 163 new homes have been built. Counting move-in houses during that time, there have been a total of 183 homes added to the city. largest month, building wise during the past year was September, when 10 permits were Issued for construction valued at \$130,000. September's total was the only monthly total to top \$100,000 although two other months were In excess of \$80,000.

January 14, 1960

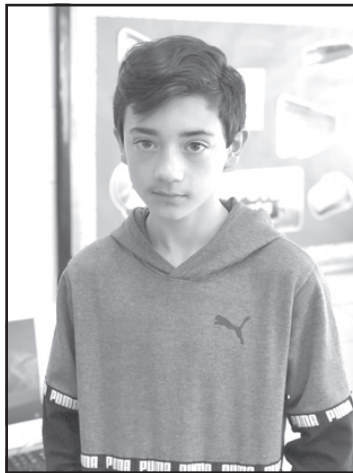

Texas Weekly Fuel Update and Outlook

Gasoline prices in Texas have risen 1.7 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$1.94/g yesterday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 13,114 stations in Texas. This compares with the national average that has increased 0.6 cents per gallon versus last week to \$2.24/g, according to GasBuddy.

Including the change locally during the past week, prices yesterday were 35.4 cents per gallon lower than a year ago and are 6.3 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has dropped 10.4 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 29.1 cents per gallon lower than a year ago.

"The national average price for gasoline has seen little change in the last week in most areas, but this period remains the calm ahead of the storm, especially if China's trade deal pans out into a larger trade agreement with the U.S.," said Patrick DeHaan, head of petroleum analysis for GasBuddy. "The transition to summer gasoline, a three month process, will begin in the weeks ahead, so the current period is still the calm before the storm. If a broad trade agreement with China does come to pass, that will enhance the normal rise of 35-75 cents per gallon that we see nationally from February's low prices to Memorial Day weekend's prices- so what you see today will likely feel like a completely different world than what we expect near Memorial Day."

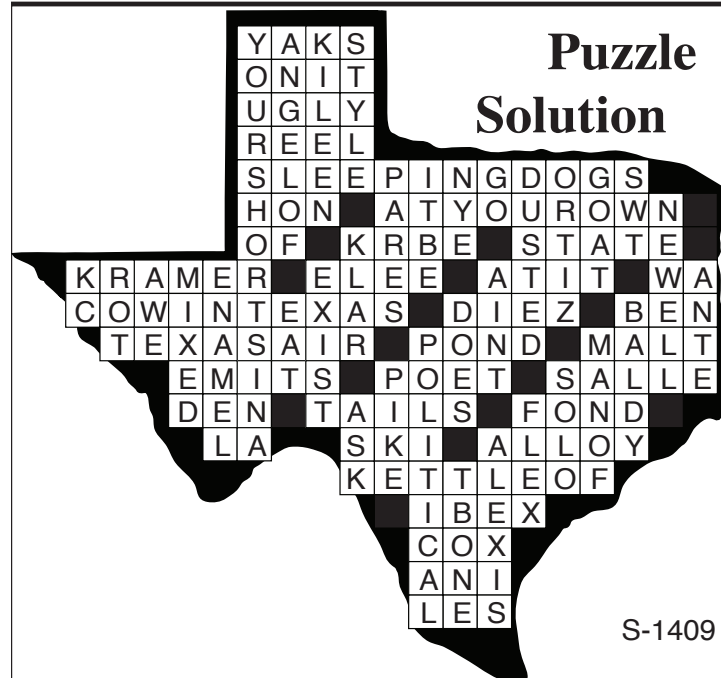

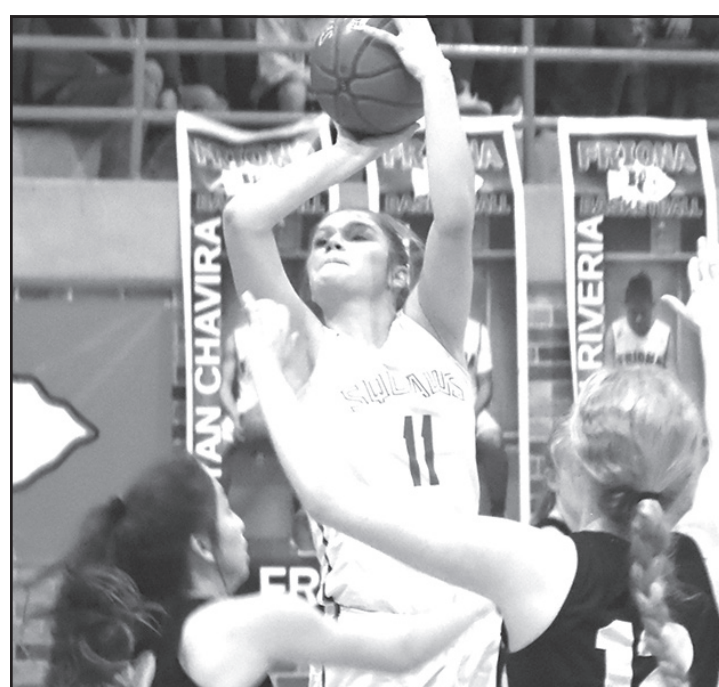

Federal student aid programs can help pay college costs

The federal government sponsors numerous financial aid programs that can help students and their parents pay college expenses. This brief summary from KHEAA describes the more common federal grant and loan programs. Grants generally do not have to be repaid, but loans do.
Federal Pell Grant: Pell Grants will provide up to \$6,195 for the 2019-2020 school year for undergraduates with financial need. The amount may change each year.
Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant: grants that provide up to \$4,000 per year for undergraduate students who have exceptional financial need.
Federal Direct Loans: These loans are available to undergraduate, graduate and professional students. The amount students may borrow depends on their year in school.
Federal PLUS Loan: Parents of dependent undergraduate students may qualify for PLUS Loans, depending on the parents' credit ratings. The amount available depends on how much other financial aid the student receives. Graduate and professional students may apply for PLUS Loans if they have exhausted their Direct Loan eligibility.
The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is used to apply for all of these programs. Families seeking a PLUS Loan must also submit a separate application.
KHEAA is a public, non-profit agency established in 1966 to improve students' access to college. It provides information about financial aid and financial literacy at no cost to students and parents. KHEAA also helps colleges manage their student loan default rates and verify information submitted on the FAFSA. For more information about those services, visit www.kheaa.com.
