The first and most essential requisite for the adornment of a rural home is, that the owner should possess an unconquerable love for the beautiful in nature-a love for trees and plants and fruits so great that he cannot be happy without them. This will remove all difficulties and success will follow. Then the arrange ment of the buildings should receive due attention. Each one should be so placed as to invite ornamentation by tree or vine, and beauty when planted.

also situated as to increase this The dwelling should be some rods from the public road, and also from the other buildings, to give room for a spacious lawn, which should be covered with grass i any climate where nature spreads this lovely carpet. Where she does not, there is more abundant room for gadening and bedding plants. Then the fruit and vegetable garden should be located a pleasant distance from the house-near enough to be seen and enjoyed and cared for by the family. A garden on each side of the lawn, wherever this is practicable, will be found very satisfactory. To secure a certain growth of trees and shrubs, begin with such as can be found grow-

ing in the same locality. This will insure success in the first efforts. Many very desirable trees, and some very beautiful ones, can casily be found growing in their native wilds. To these should be added such varieties as have been tester and found hardy; with these should be set the hardy fruit trees, a few at a time, if necessary, and with great carefulness. Do not say "I cannot plant a large orchard, so I will plant none at all." 




