for ownership. British buyers on this scale may be assumed not to have laid out so much money without evidence that they will be allowed to enjoy its fruits. The question now for a country like the United States would tolerate transplantation of the British system of vast territorial inheritances is more serious. If the noblemen and gentlemen who have been investing in America do the same as the British do, it may be debated whether they will not find the local prejudice too strong for them. For proprietors who mean to occupy their land themselves there is abundance of room and welcome across the Atlantic. An Englishman is free to own any quantity of acres from 100 to 1,000,000 which he can and will farm. It is surprising that British land owners, with several sons accustomed to rural parents, and without an opportunity at home of turning to them for a profession, have not more generally taken to planning on the estates of their own on the east and west North American continent. It remains to be seen whether some of the recent American purchases which have provoked antipathy have not been made with this very land in view. A majority of them have plainly the innocent character of investments.
