

America, a Proclamation: . WHEREAS, Public policy demands that the public domain shall be reserved for the occupancy of actual settlers in good faith, and that our people who seek homes upon such domain shall, in no wise, be prevented by wrongful interference from the free and safe entry thereon, to which they




