

Decision Affecting the Validity of the Virginia Funding Act of 1871. RICHMOND, VA., January 15. - The Supreme Court of Virginia yesterday rendered a decision in the case of Greenhow, State Treasurer, vs. Vashon, in the matter of the State debt. They held: First, that the contract of March 31, 1871, under which coupons receivable for taxes were issued, did not have the essential element of valid consideration, and on a proper case they would hold the funding act of March 31, 1871, invalid and illegal. Second, that the coupons could not be received in payment of that portion of the State taxes set apart by the Constitution of Virginia for the maintenance of public free schools. Judge Richardson delivered the opinion of the Court, Judge Lewis, President of the Court, alone dissenting.

Decision Affecting the Validity of the Vir-RICHMOND, VA., January 15. - The Supreme Court of Virginia yesterday rendered a decision in the case of Greenhow, State Treasurer, vs. Vashon, in the matter of the State debt. They held: First, that the contract of March 31, 1871, under which coupons receivable for taxes were issued, did not have the essential element of valid consideration, and on a proper case they would hold the funding act of March 31, 1871, invalid and illegal. Second, that the coupons could not be received in payment of that portion of the State taxes set apart by the Constitution of lirginia for the maintenance of public free schools. Judge Richardson delivered the opinion of the Court, Judge Lewis, President of the Court, alone dissenting.






