The Alliance Society fostered. The social feature of the Alliance is of itself a source of much pleasure as well as of much merit, and we will try to present to your minds some of the important points for your consideration.

Our constitutional work is the promotion of peace, prosperity, truth, and justice. You see at once the field of work is in trying to cover too many eggs and hatching but few. We need concentrated action and sure plans. To have this requires a co-operative system adapted to our local and general wants. I submit the following plan for consideration: First, divide the county into trade districts, enrolling each Alliance in the district in which its trading point or post office is situated.

Second, have a trade committee for each district composed of one delegate from each Alliance in the district. Third, let the chairman of the district committee for the county committee or for any number of districts that may see proper to unite. Fourth, let the county committee elect an executive committee, as conveniently situated as possible, for the superintending of general business, with powers to call the entire committee together when needed.

Fifth, either committee may employ an agent on reasonable terms, to make any desired purchase or sale. Sixth, either committee may assess a sufficient tax on its purchase or sale to meet its necessary expense for the same. Under these plans each Alliance has a trade agent whose duty it is to consult the wants of his Alliance and represent it in the committee which will make any desired purchase of staple articles upon wholesale principles.

Another good work of great benefit and but little expense would be a co-operative insurance company in each county. First, have an obligation requiring each member to render his house at a fair valuation and to pay promptly as possible, all assessments for the payment of policies. Second, let any one who fails to comply with this obligation be excluded from the company. Third, if a house is burned belonging to the company, find the ratio of the policy on said house, the full amount of policies in the county, and assess each member on his policy accordingly. For example, if a house is burnt worth \$500. The full amount of policies is \$100,000. A's policy is fifty cents per one hundred dollars of this amount. You could work through the above committee, with but little trouble. If there is no loss, there is no expense, and if there is a loss, you pay less than you would under a favor, protect your own house and aid others in protecting theirs. J. G.
