Resolutions of Knights of Labor at Springfield. At a regular meeting of Springfield assembly No. 549, K. of L. held April 24th, 1886, the following preamble and resolutions were unanimously adopted:

Whereas, the Parker county Alliance at its last meeting formulated a plan to put candidates in the field for state and county officers in the interest of the laboring classes and invited the co-operation of the Knights of Labor; and whereas, we view with suspicion and alarm any movement which has a tendency to convert our order into a political machine, thereby diverting it from its true aims and purposes and prostituting it to the personal aggrandizement of unscrupulous and designing politicians who are ever ready to sacrifice the interest of the toiling masses for their own political advancement; and whereas the composition of the committee that formulated the "Parker Plan," so called, is such as to excite our liveliest apprehension, as it was made up almost exclusively of free seekers, some of whom have jumped astride of every conceivable hobby to ride into office; therefore be it resolved.

1st. That we the Knights of Labor of Springfield assembly No. 549, do hereby endorse the views of T. V. Powderly, General Master Workman, and A. Dunlap, our Master Workman and President of the Grand State Alliance, who announce that the Knights of Labor and Farmers Alliance are not and cannot be made political machines with which to hoist into power disappointed and broken down office seekers.

2nd. That we will use every effort to keep our order true to its first principles, aims and purposes and to prevent ourselves being made the tools of designing demagogues.

3rd. That the Secretary be instructed to send a copy of these resolutions with request to publish, to the Dallas News, Ft. Worth Gazette, Times and Sun of Weatherford, Jacksono Rural Citizen and Springfield Pilot.
