HYBRID GRAIN SORGHUM... There are four farmers who have applied for seed of two kinds to grow their own hybrid grain sorghum seed for this year in Cochran County.

These farmers will receive their seed from Dr. Jack King, Extension Service, Lubbock, Texas. The seed received will be for the planting of one acre of land. The pollinator seed will be planted in two or four rows, the male sterile seed will be planted adjacent to pollinator seed in 6 or 8 rows. The six or eight rows will be harvested for seed to plant as a hybrid seed in 1957. The pollinator seed will be harvested for grain only in 1956. The planting requirements and roguing will be done by the farmer as prescribed in letter from Dr. King. If any other farmers are interested in securing seed as an apprentice sorghum grower for this year, please contact your County Agent soon; so you can be included on the list of apprentice growers of hybrid seed.

Mr. and Mrs. Bill Millan of Muleshoe were present and Mr. Millan, the president of Bailey County Farm Bureau was the principal speaker.

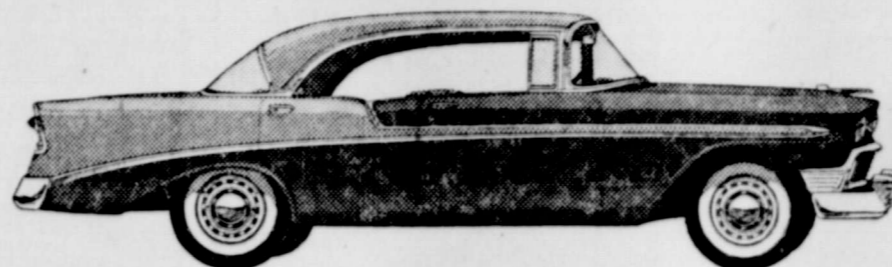

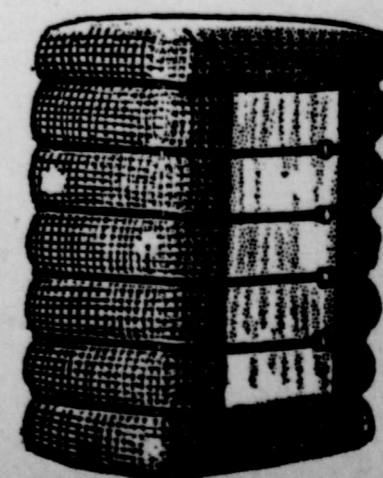
Some \$33,000 in savings will be returned to the patrons in cash from the last season's ginnings.

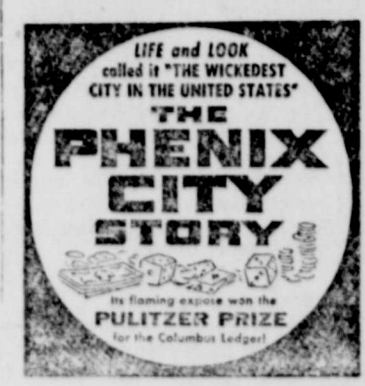
