National survey shows income higher than average

How well are Cochran County families managing in these days of high inflation?

To what extent have their incomes been moving up to compensate for the rise in the cost of living?

For most local families, the wage and salary gains have been substantial. As a result, a greater proportion of them are now to be found in the middle and upper income brackets and fewer in the lower brackets than ever before, according to a nationwide survey of income distribution. There has been a progressive shift upward.

The changes are detailed in a report released by the Standard Rate and Data Service, a marketing publication. It lists the percentage of local households in each income category.

The survey was designed to give a better picture of each community's earning picture and buying power than was afforded by its average income alone.

It shows whether there are a small number of families with high incomes balancing out a much larger number with small incomes, or whether earnings are well spread.

In Cochran County, the figures

show, both the level of earnings and the distribution are relatively good.

Locally, during the past year, the proportion of households with effective buying incomes of \$8,000 or over, after payment of their personal taxes, was 48.0 percent.

It was a larger proportion than was reported for many sections of the country.

As to the various income groupings in the local area, the survey report shows that 21.1 percent of the households have a

Chamber announces holiday activities

Santa Claus will make his first appearance of the year during the program.

Morton schools will dismiss at 2:30 p.m. for the program and the festivities will begin at 3 p.m. Santa Claus will make his entrance at 4:30, courtesy of a Morton Fire Department vehicle. He will have candy for the children.

Ray Luper, Christmas shopping promotion chairman, outlined for the members the promotion as planned and advised them that the promotion will get underway immediately. Today's

Best Mortons

This Thanksgiving time the affluent Americans are down to our heavily laden tables to enjoy the bounty of our blessed land, it is also a time for reflection and thought for those of the world less fortunate.

Believe that the vast majority of Americans feel deep sympathy for those in foreign lands who are either starving or living on a starvation level. Also feel that the average American would be happy to share a part of his worldly goods and we mean Americans of all walks of life — to those of the world less fortunate.

So believe — and in our country — that the interference of the government always negates the efforts to reach the people with our commodities. As soon as they reach the market or are absorbed by government grist mill of bureaucracy.

In every case in history the receiving end will not allow one to observe the intentions of our aid materials. Who saw the Sunday night television show "Who Shall Feed the World" saw a relatively affluent and certainly not a starving Indian and a truly affluent farmer in contrast. In television style, they did not show the conditions as they are.

They showed a few starving to death — with starvation or further starvation — but for the most part portrayed India as a land which just needs a little money.

Things were brought out carefully: India is a proud country, has never, and will never, admit that one of its people has ever died of starvation. Secondly, India is a country of large families and it refutes the premise of a population problem. A million new babies per year wonder how long it is before they wake up to the problem.

Opening the young season with three road games, the Tribe systematically demolished Floyd, New Mexico last Tuesday 102-60; Frenship Friday by 89-47 and Seminole by 74-60 Monday night.

Viet vets may have pay coming

Many Vietnam Era veterans are unaware of their entitlement to back pay, for active military service between October 1, 1972, and January 1, 1973.

A recent Federal court decision ordered the Federal Government to pay a salary differential of approximately 6.14 percent to all military personnel and veterans who served on a active duty between these dates.

Military personnel still on active duty will receive the pay automatically, while the veteran whose activity duty terminated after October 1, 1972, will have to apply for the pay, according to Walter G. Sandefer, Veterans Service Officer for Cochran County.

Veterans should make out a back pay claim — a short letter is all that is necessary. It should include name, Social Security number, military service number if one was assigned, rank, current mailing address, date separated from service, and duty station between October 1, 1972 and January 1, 1973.

On occasion, the caseworker will be required to be out of the office in the afternoon, but will post a notice as to how long the office will be closed and when the caseworker will return.

of \$5,000 to \$8,000, that 12.1 percent have between \$8,000 and \$10,000, that 19.4 percent are in the \$10,000 to \$15,000 bracket and that 16.5 percent have incomes in excess of that. The remainder have \$5,000 or less left after taxes.

Although incomes have been rising, year after year, they have not been advancing fast enough to match the increase in living costs. At the present rate, some gains will fall several percent behind price hikes by the end of 1974.

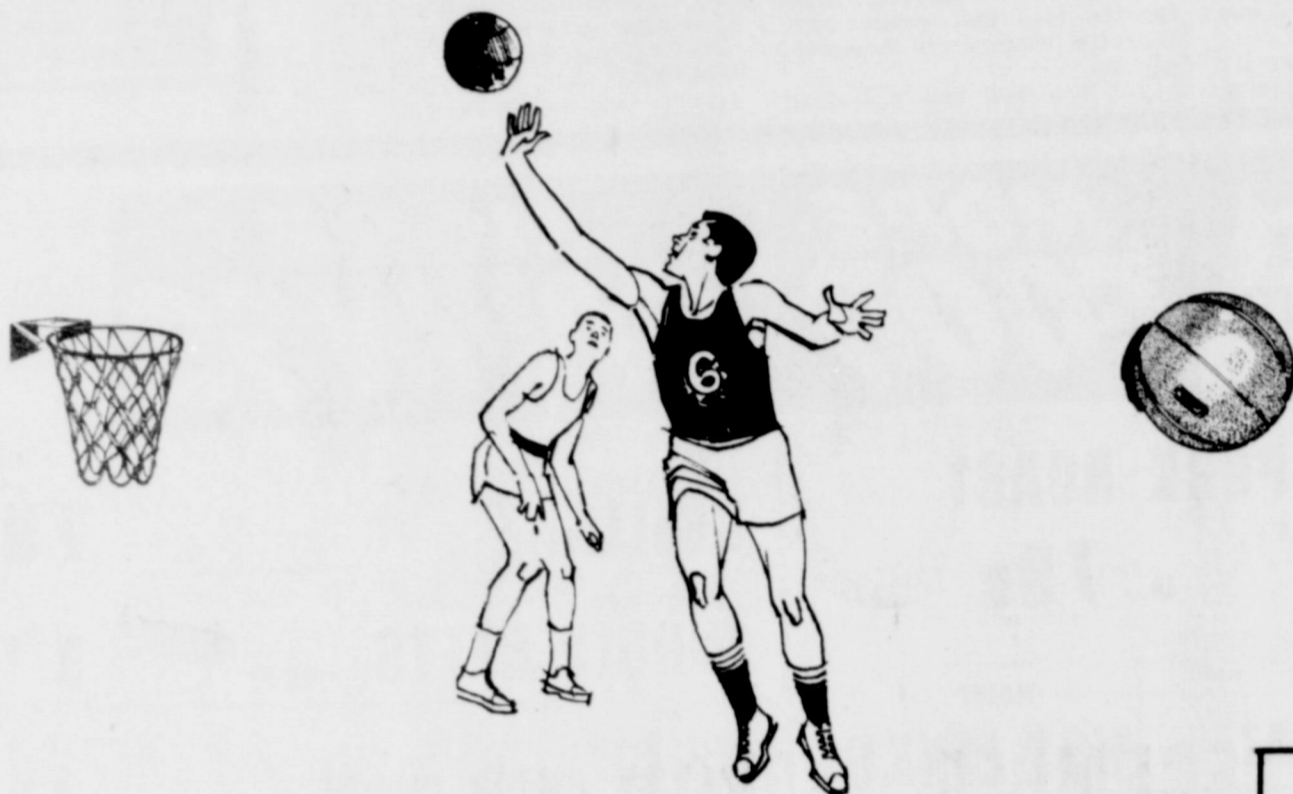

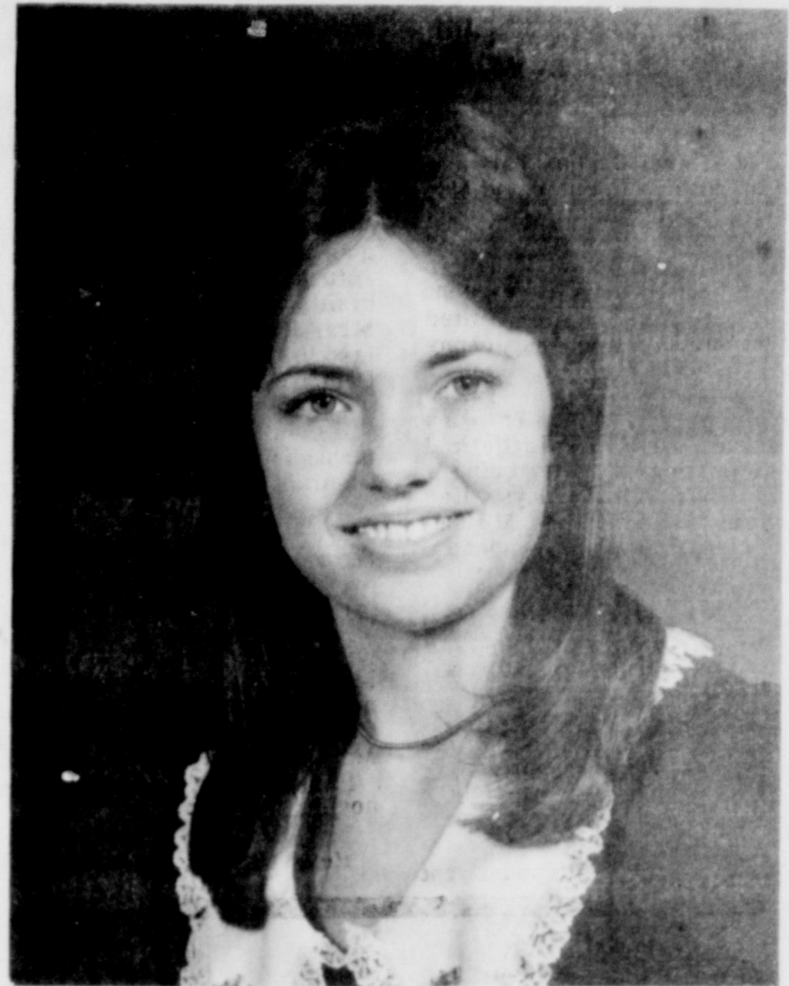

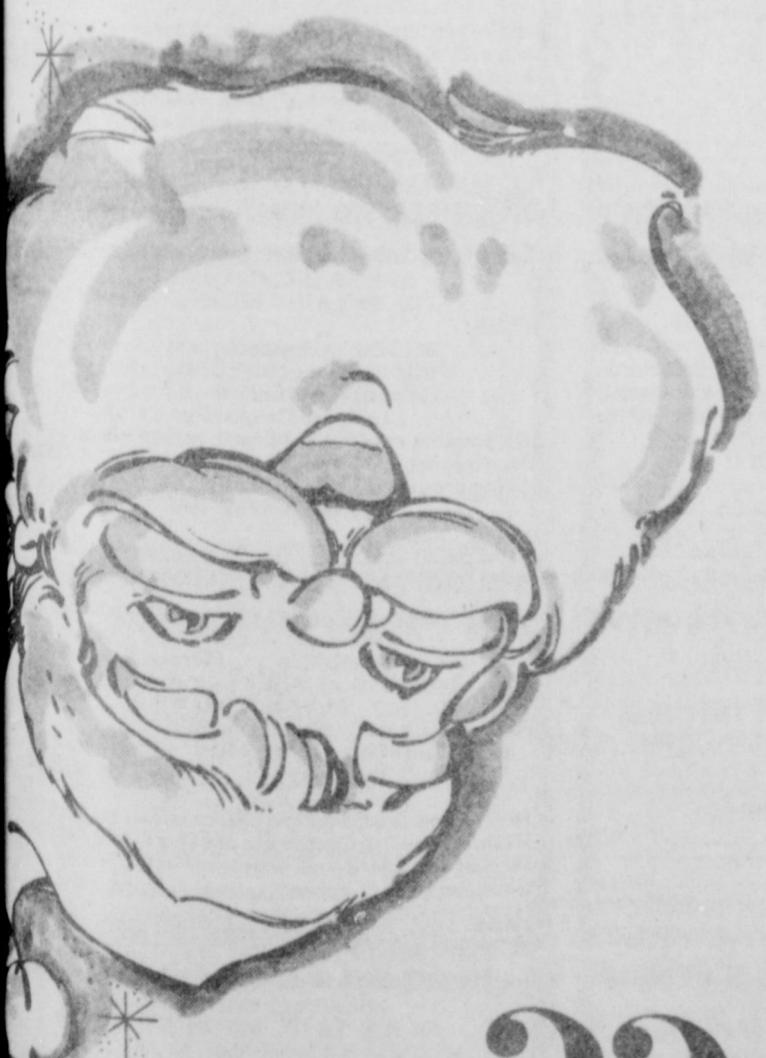
