## Helpful Hints From Me To Thee

September is National Better Breakfast Month, and the first month of school. You may want to examine your menus and investigate ways to encourage your children to eat a better breakfast.

Teachers testify that good breakfasts relate directly to reduced absenteeism and tardiness. They also observe that a good breakfast to start the day increases the alertness and attention span of the students.

In addition to better attendance, children are more attentive and responsive and there are fewer behavior problems when they eat breakfasts. Furthermore, decreases in desk-slumping and sleeping, increases in weight, more class response and less fighting has been reported.

Here is an idea to make any breakfast better. Orange nut biscuits are made quickly with ready-to-bake biscuits, frozen orange juice concentrate and brown sugar. Place

biscuits from 8 ounce package in ungreased 8 or 9 inch round pan and bake according to package directions. Combine 1/4 cup undiluted orange juice concentrate with 3 tablespoons brown sugar. Spoon over biscuits. Bake 4 or 5 minutes longer.

School is already in full swing which means the necessity of after school snacks.

Peanuts can be the answer to this problem and many others. Aside from being good in cookies, cakes and candies, peanuts are delicious in a variety of main dishes. They also add nutrition.

Peanuts are plentiful now, says USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service. Use them in these time-saving desserts for snacktime.

**CEREAL TOFFEE SQUARES COOKY MIXTURE**  
1/3 cup butter or margarine  
1/2 cup creamy-style peanut butter

1 pound marshmallows  
1 tablespoon milk  
4 cups crisp corn puffs, puffed wheat, puffed rice, or pre-sweetened puffed cereal  
**TOPPING**  
2 (6 oz) packs semi-sweet chocolate bits  
1/2 cup salted peanuts, chopped  
3/4 cup of any above cereal

Combine butter, peanut butter, marshmallows and milk in a heavy Dutch oven. Place over low heat and stir constantly until all ingredients are melted and smooth. Add cereal and stir until all cereal is coated with peanut butter mixture.

Remove from heat and turn mixture into 2 greased pans, 11-3/8 x 7 1/2 x 1 3/4 inches. Press into even layer. Melt chocolate bits in top of double boiler. Spread 1/2 of chocolate over each pan of cookies and sprinkle tops with chopped peanuts and cereal. Cool. Cut into bars or squares. Yield: About 96 squares. (Note: The cereal used for the topping should be the one selected for the cookie mixture.)

Busy mothers will be delighted with the ease and speed of preparation of Cereal Toffee Squares. Teenagers might enjoy making a batch of this delicious confection too. It makes a generous amount. If you prefer, the chocolate topping can be omitted and the recipe cut into bars.
