Spearman basketball fans were treated to the battle of the "Super Stars" at Lynx Stadium (Gym) Tuesday evening, when the AA state runner-up Lynettes, met the Class B state champion Follett team. The Super Stars from Spearman trounced Follett 71 to 37. It could have been 100 to 30. It is impossible to say which girl, or group of girls is the most effective or outstanding on this 1976-77 team. Three super forwards are on the team, but the guards are coming a long so fast, they must be noticed also.

To sum up this year's Lynette team, we like the words of last year's Dalhart coach, "I have a real good senior team of girls." I come down to Spearman, and get beat 4 points by a bunch of Freshmen and sophomore girls. "What 'in the name of heaven' are we supposed to do?" And, this just about sums up the Lynettes for this year, & for several years to come! No hope for the opposition!

What makes this team of super-stars so super? Hard work and sacrifice and hard devoted work on the part of Coach Weese and his coaching staff.

A powerful B team, under Coach Harley Lewis, is still undefeated this year. Such future stars as Phyllis Randall, Carol Bivens, Denise Standerfer, Patty Blanton, Mary Lee Cooley, Peggy Floyd, Gaye Daniel, Kathy Dear, Debbie Weaver, Donna Fryrear, Vicki Scribner, Dixie Sheppard, Monette Slater, and Nancy Lair, make up the B team roster. They defeated Follett's state championship B team 52-51, with Coach Lewis using all of his players to keep the game under 100 points.

In the feature game at Lynx gym Tuesday night Patterson, Shieldknight and Smith hit in the double figures, all three used sparingly. Other forwards scoring were Schell and Brummett, who look very impressive in their games already this year.

The starting guards for this year's Lynettes are Hohertz, Daniel, Schell and Ricketts.

In the big game against Follett Tuesday night, Patterson hit 25 points; Smith 14 points; Shieldknight 23

points, Shieldknight was extremely accurate from the free-throw line.

Also, Shieldknight is the wild-card for the Lynette team. She can be used everywhere on the court and will be used as a guard in future games, if necessary, most sports fans feel.

Sheila Patterson, the "machine" is used to score points. Sheila is not human when it comes to basketball. She is an accurate computer type basketball player. She is only a Junior. It is almost beyond human comprehension to watch her shoot the ball. Her percentage of field goal shooting is so high, and her teamwork is so effective it is impossible to stop her from scoring.

Also belonging to the computer-type team, is Anita Smith, the only Sr. on the forward end. She is equally effective as the other two forwards, and was actually leading the team in scoring when she left the game Tuesday evening. Anita is successful under the basket, accurate, and is able to score at any time in the game.

But, possibly the most impressive part of this year's Lynette team is the guard department. There are no "super stars" in the guard dept. yet. It is going to take about 2 more games to develop these guards into super stars. And, there are some fine prospects in the guard-end of the team. They will be tough in another game or two.

The Lynettes will go to Friona this weekend along with the Lynx team. Both of these teams are the defending tournament champions. Both teams plan to win again this year. Check the bracket in this week's paper, and see when the teams play.

The Lynettes are undefeated this year. But, they have had one or two close games. Their old foe Robinson will be back at Austin and also at Duncannonville. But, we won't go that far in the future this week, we will just concentrate on the Friona Tournament, and you can bet the Lynettes will be the team to watch this weekend.
