Austin. - The State Treasurer's report for the quarter ending February 29 shows that the total receipts of the State Treasury amounted to \$5,811,988.30, while the disbursements amounted to \$3,820,784.93, leaving a balance in the Treasury of \$1,991.203.32, and bonds held by the State in the sum of \$15,926,057.03.

Austin. - Texas State University leads all Southern universities in point of registration of pupils, the total being 2273, surpassing Tulane University by 700 pupils.


