PRISON SENTENCE LAW

Austin, June 20. District judges over the state were today addressed by Assistant Attorney General C. E. Lane on their failure to comply with the provisions of the inderterminate sentence law of the last legislature. General Lane points out that the law provides that in passing sentence in all cases where the party convicted is over 17 years old and where the jury fixes a term in the penitentiary, the sentence shall be for an indeterminate time, fixing the maximum punishment provided by law for the crime for which accused is convicted.


