Trouble in Balkans May Be Settled by Intervention of The League of Nations

CALL PARIS MEETING

Briand Orders Session Monday-Bulgaria Withdraws Troops--Nations Warned

By United Press.

GENEVA, Oct. 23 .- Acting to halt definitely the Greco-Bulgarian hostilities, the League today warned the warring partied to halt hostilities and summoned the council to act on the crisis Monday. This act was undertaken by French foreign minister Briand as president of the League, following an appeal by Bulgaria under articles Nos. 10 and 11 of the League, lemanding immediate convocation of the council on the Greco-Bulgarian

conflict. The Bulgarian appeal said Bulgaria has ordered a temporary withdrawal of troops from the Macedonia frontier for the purpose of preventing a conflict with the Greeks, and as evidence of Bulgaria's complete confidence in a just intervention by the League to settle the crisis.

The League council will sit Monday Paris upon Briand's call.

In Special Communication to Highway Commission, Requests no More Contracts Be Let

SPEAKS OF HIGH PROFITS

Claims Charges of Exhorbitant Profits Made-Disapproves Injunction Proceedings

By United Press. AUSTIN, Oct. 3.-In view of charges that "exhorbitant profits have been made in contracts for surfacing or topping work on state highways during the past summer," Governor Miriam Fergu son today, in a special communica tion to Frank V. Lanham, chairman of the State Highway Commission, requested that no new projects of this character be entered into and that present contractors of surfacing or topping work be required to fully complete their contracts entered into by the State Highway Commis-

sion with them. The Attorney General has openly stated that he intends to bring suit at once to cancel the contracts, the Gov ernor said, and added that she had been informed that "he has entered into an agreement in private with the American Road Co. of Dallas with out cosulting the Highway Department, to withhold any injunction proceedings as incident to his suit for

cancellation of contracts." The effect of this procedure, the overnor said, would be to relieve con ince to their agreement and "leave the heavy expense to be borne by the




