

NEFF DISCUSSES PROHIBITION AT N. Y. CHAUTAUQUA

URGES IMPORTANCE OF ENFORCING EIGHTEENTH AMENDMENT
ADVOCATES OF REPEAL CRITICIZED BY SPEAKER

General Subject of Address Was "The Price of Civilization"

CHAUTAUQUA, N. Y., Aug. 15.—It is the solemn duty of a state to help enforce the prohibition amendment, as well as the entire constitution, Governor Pat M. Neff of Texas said here at the annual Chautauqua exercises. He ridiculed a claim that because prohibition laws are violated they should be repealed. No law should be repealed because it is broken, he declared.

"The American people will never take a backward step by repealing the amendments," he asserted. "The repeal of prohibition is not a trial of the prohibition amendment, but a trial of the American republic and all law."

An appeal for enforcement of prohibition by statutes, and observance of laws in general, was made by Mr. Neff. Advocates of prohibition repeal were criticized by the speaker who declared the "bootlegger," the whiskey man and those who sympathize with those, are the ones who favor prohibition repeal.

Klan Loses Fight To Incorporate In New York State

By Universal Service.
ALBANY, N. Y., Aug. 14.—The Ku Klux Klan in this state has lost its fight, temporarily at least, to become an incorporated body.

In a decision announced at Elizabethtown, Supreme Court Justice Staley granted an injunction sought by Attorney General Sherman to prevent the Klan and its sister organization, the Kamella, from operating in this state as a corporation.

Justice Staley characterized the alterations made in the incorporation papers by members of the Klan, "not only an illegal and unauthorized act, but also an imposition and fraud upon the court."

At the hearing in Elizabethtown yesterday, members of the Klan admitted they had altered their incorporation papers, but claimed the changes were suggested by an employee in the secretary of state's office.

It is believed the Klan will attempt to file a new petition, providing it can secure approval of the papers by some supreme court justice. Such procedure by the Klan would be favored by Deputy Attorney General Griffin, who appeared for the state in the litigation.

Justice Staley declared in his decision that the alteration of the incorporation papers is "obviously one which effects a material change in the powers thereby granted."

DECLARES MEREDITH SAW PLAN LAID FOR AGRICULTURAL PANIC

CHARGES FORMER SECRETARY FAILED TO WARN FARMERS

BROOKHART REPLIES TO MEREDITH STATEMENT

Says It Was Late in the Fall of 1920 When Policy Was First Made Public

RADCLIFFE, Iowa, Aug. 15.—The charges that E. T. Meredith, secretary of agriculture in the Wilson cabinet saw plans laid for the deflation of agriculture and failed to warn the farmers of the country or to prevent the contraction of the value of their products, was made by United States Senator Smith W. Brookhart of Iowa in an address at a farm bureau picnic here today.

"I instead of protesting or acting to avert the deflation," Senator Brookhart declared, "the secretary of agriculture, Wall Street game and helped produce the greatest panic in farm prices in the history of agriculture."

Mr. Brookhart's address was in the nature of a reply to a recent statement by Mr. Meredith in which the latter expressed the opinion the secretary was over estimating the seriousness of the reduction in the price of wheat and other farm products.

"Mr. Meredith is the same Meredith who was a member of the Wilson cabinet when it was decided to deflate the American farmer," Senator Brookhart said in part.

"It was late in the fall of 1920 when this policy was made public," Mr. Meredith knew it from the first and also during all the period "secret" in Wall Street's hands and the big fellows a — except Henry Ford were having in an ample supply of long time credit to tide them over the deflation period.

Meredith also knew that the contraction of credit in the fall would reduce the price of farm products. As secretary of agriculture representing the farmers of the United States it was his duty to prevent this credit contraction. He performed no such duty. 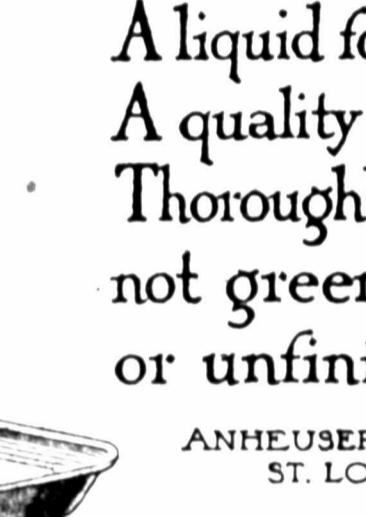
Skelly Oil Co. Has New Well Young County

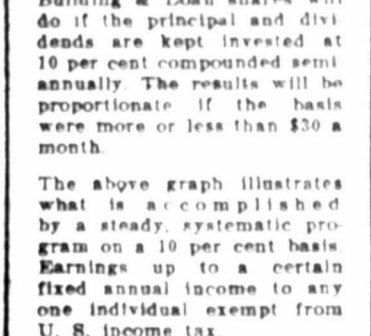
