COUNTY AGENT REPORTS

The Federal Gas Tax refund of 4 cents per gallon on gasoline used on a farm for farming purposes will now be claimed as a tax credit on the annual income tax report and must be filed before the end of the tax reporting period, which is April 15. Gas tax credits will not be allowed on late reports.

The tax credit has been extended to include the federal tax on lubricant oil at 6 cents per gal. and on diesel fuel and special motor fuels used other than in highway vehicles.

Formerly the gas tax refund period was July 1 to June 30, and claims were to be filed by September 30. Since this change was initiated in 1966, this will be the first full year for the new filing system. Farmers will claim the federal tax credit on qualifying fuels and lubricants purchased during the 1967 calendar year.

A point too often overlooked by cattlemen is the proper grazing distribution and degree of utilization. This is one of the most important items in successful ranching.

Your stocking rates may be correct for your ranch, but if your grazing is not properly distributed, in some areas may be over-used while others remain almost untouched. This means you don't receive the maximum net returns possible from your ranch.

Now, at the end of the growing season, is the time to look over your range and see how you are doing with your distribution and utilization.

Are areas near the water heavily used, while far corners of your place are unused? Is your salt supply near the water? The solution to this problem is to place the salt in areas that have been underused. Moving salt locations several times during the year will increase grass utilization in the out of the way places.

Recent research has shown that salt should be considered as a distribution tool rather than a nutrient. I would like to give you a few reminders in planting trees, shrubs, and other plants, as I am sure many of you will be setting out plants in the next few months.

First of all select a good variety, with a good root system and top, from a competent nurseryman. Set plants no deeper than they were grown in the nursery. Many plants are lost because they were planted too deep and the roots die from lack of oxygen. Fill around the plant with good weed, disease and nematode free sand.

Watering at the time of planting is important. Plan to water the plants regularly the first year. This includes thorough watering in the winter and summer.

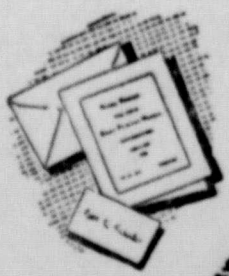

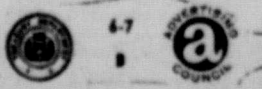

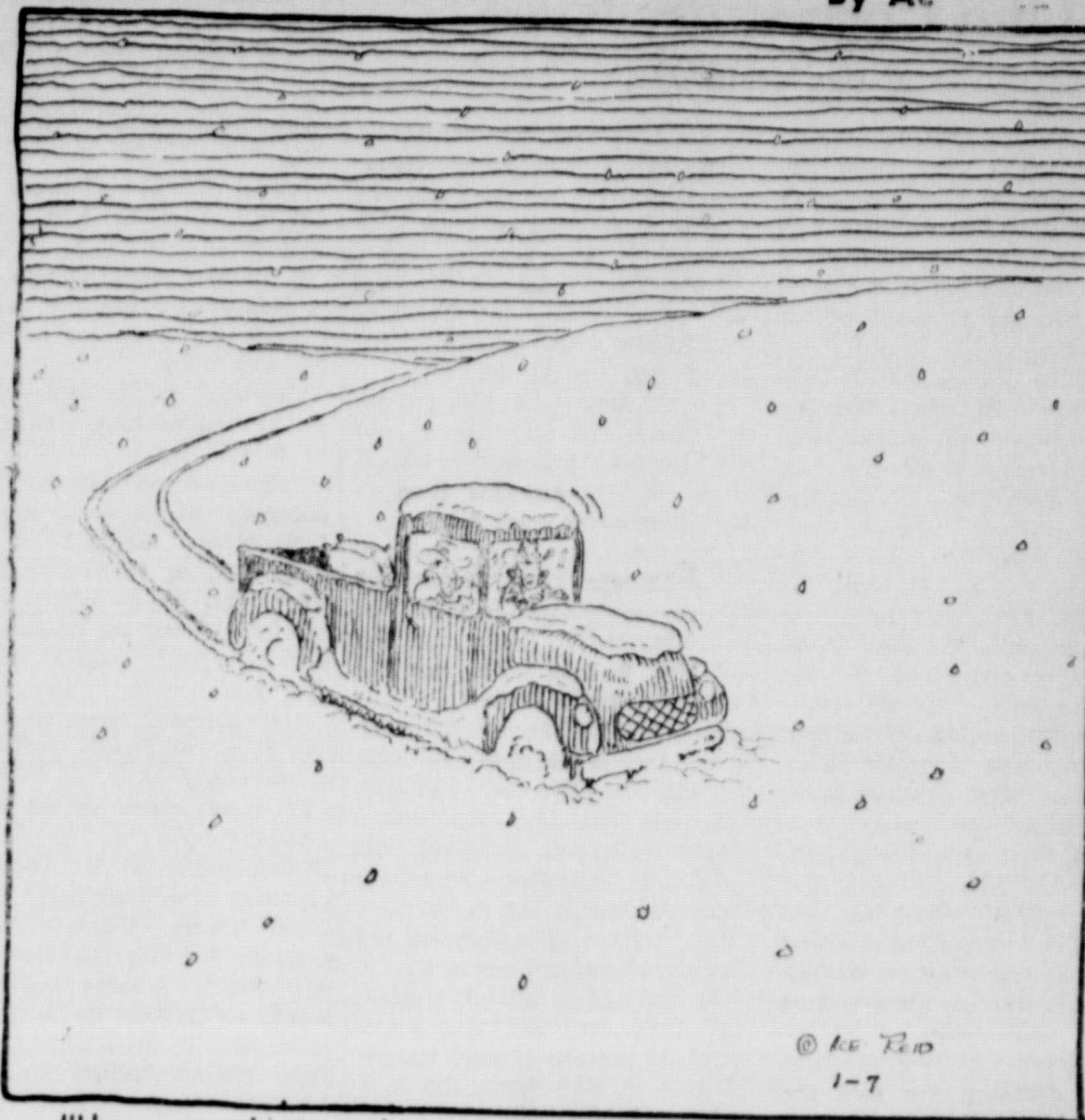
