Ben Rhodes, Chairman of the Neils-Meridian Creek Watershed Committee, reported that approval had been received for the program to be surveyed and that a work plan can be prepared.

He has requested landowners living on Neils and Meridian Creeks to contact him and sign a permission slip for personnel of the Soil Conservation Service to enter upon their property so surveying can be done. 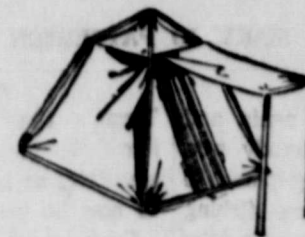

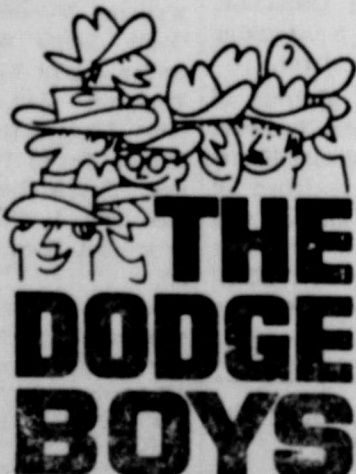

**Social Security Questions & Answers**

Question: My husband, who is 53, and our two sons operated our farm until 6 months ago, when my husband suffered a severe stroke. He is now completely paralyzed and cannot even speak. My sons still operate the farm and insist that their father should receive the net profits. If my husband takes these profits, will he still be entitled to monthly social security disability benefits?

Answer: Yes. To receive monthly social security disability benefits, your husband must be unable to engage in substantial gainful activity in the operation of the farm. The income he receives does not affect his eligibility for disability benefits. Call any social security office for help in applying for disability benefits.

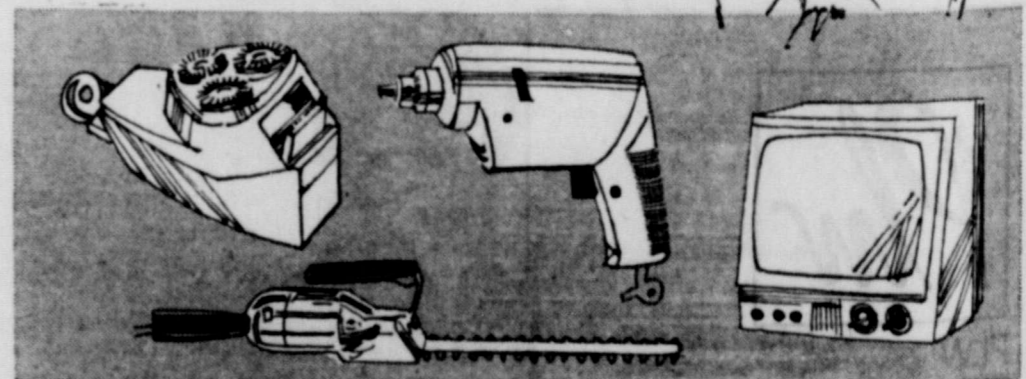

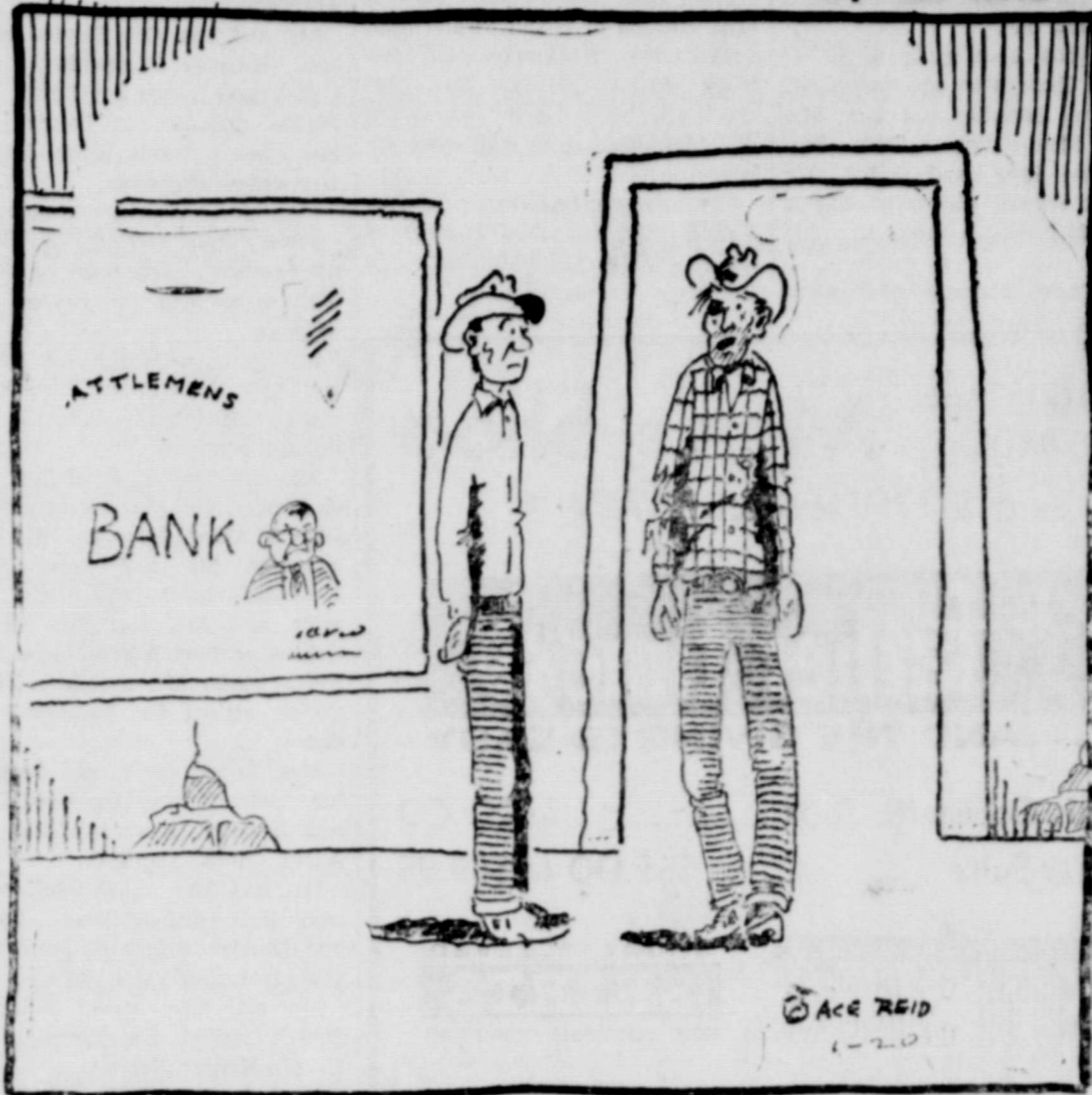
