Two County Candidates Announce

With the approach of a brand new year, politics saw the first two candidates in county circles this week, when two incumbent office holders announced.

First candidate to announce with

the News Review was Leslie Patterson, Commissioner of Precinct 3, who will seek his first full term of office.

Next in line was L. H. (Boots) Young, who announced for his second term as Sheriff.

Patterson will complete the unexpired term of the late Fred Rainwater at the end of 1972. He won nomination to the commissioner's post by defeating two other candidates in last year's primary.

Young, who is completing a full term as County Sheriff, won his first election over two opponents, including the incumbent.

One other county office holder which involves local voters has said that she would seek re-election. Mrs. Pearl B. Williams stated earlier that she would ask for another term as County Tax Assessor-Collector in the 1972 election.

Still another office holder, County Attorney H. A. Leaverton, has said that he would not be a candidate for re-election, and newcomer Jim Crouch has indicated that he would run for the office.

All in all, a relatively light political year is anticipated in county elections, but state and national elections should be interesting enough to make residents want to qualify for their voting privilege.
