# City Council Turns Thumbs Down on Gas Company's 10 Percent Rate Boost Request

Hico City Council, meeting in regular session Monday night of this week, turned thumbs down on Lone Star Gas Company's requested rate increase of ten percent. The Council voted to table the request for 30 days to have "another look" at the proposal.

Curtis Jennings, local manager for the gas company, said that his firm was asking for the increase due to low earning rate of the Hico facility, caused by higher gas prices, higher interest rates on

borrowed money, higher property and equipment costs, increased costs for employee compensation, and increased taxes.

Jennings said that the Railroad Commission, which regulates rates that may be charged by the gas company, allows a fair earning of eight percent on an investment, and that the Hico rate had dropped far below that figure. He stated that actually, Lone Star needed a rate boost of 23 percent to bring the Hico facility up to the allowed

profit rate. The Council agreed to study the request and take the matter up again at its July meeting.

In response to Mayor O. L. Davis' request for each Council member to offer five items that they considered to be most needed by the City at this time, the proposal of extended and improved sewer facilities was listed number one, with each of the members expressing an opinion that the work should be done. Other suggestions offered by Councilmen were: cleaning of blind corners, curbing and paving, city sidewalks, acquiring old buildings and remove, encourage clean-up of private property, opening a street and building a bridge to the western part of town, park improvements including paving of roadways in the park. Numbering of houses and street markers were also discussed.

Other discussions during the 3½ hour meeting centered around the new water well, city dump, seal coating and paving, the office building, and the possibility and feasibility of the city purchasing a garbage truck.

## Grandson of Fairy Couple is Recipient of \$2,000 Scholarship



# Railroad Denies Hike Trail Interest

T. E. Shell, executive vice-president of the Texas Central Railroad, said this week that his company had been falsely identified with the proposed hiking trail from Dublin to Walnut Springs, and offered the following statement concerning his company's position:

"In relation to the proposed Riding Trail from Dublin to Hico, it has recently been announced that the interests which own the 'Goobar Special' would benefit the most from such a trail. There was an implication that the 'Goobar Special' interests were helping to secure the trail.

"However the 'Goobar Special' will not run this summer. Thus the proposed trail would in no way benefit the owners of the 'Goobar Special' (Texas Central Railroad). Second, none of the officers of Texas Central Railroad, M. E. Shell, President, T. E. Shell, Executive Vice-President, or Fred Buchanan, General Manager, the only persons authorized to speak for the Texas Central Railroad have advocated to any commission or to any of the members thereof either directly or indirectly the acquisition of the proposed trail or authorized any parties to advocate the acquisition in the railroad's behalf. The railroad has not and does not intend to get involved in this controversy," Mr. Shell concludes.
