## Christmas Bonus Day Program Underway

### First Cash Drawing Slated Saturday, December 9th

Hico merchants kicked off their annual Christmas shopping season this week, as they began passing out tickets for the big cash drawings to be held on three separate dates between now and Christmas.

## Leasers Failing to Abide Game Laws

Hamilton County Game Management Officer Royis Tucker said this week that he had come across numerous instances where landowners leasing their property for hunting had failed to secure the Shooting Preserve License that is required by State law.

Tucker explained that any landowner leasing hunting rights for dove, quail or deer must secure the license if they accept a fee for the lease.

Tucker said that the licenses were available from him or from Blair's Hardware, and the fee was \$5.00.

The GMO also said that many people were failing to tag deer properly, and urged them to use extreme care to do this in the right manner.

If a hunter bags a buck or antlerless deer, he must attach a tag from his license immediately after the kill. The tag must be properly filled out, with name of the ranch, in what county, and the dates of kill must be punched out of the tag.

In case of antlerless deer, a tag from the hunters' license, plus an antlerless permit must be attached to the animal immediately.

Tucker said he would appreciate cooperation of both landowners and hunters in carrying out these instructions.

## FHA Committee Has New Member

Farmers Home Administration makes loans to supplement local credit for rural area development and at present is serving approximately 225 families in Hamilton County through individual type loans, and another 230 families through association type loans.

provide new rental housing facilities for six families.
