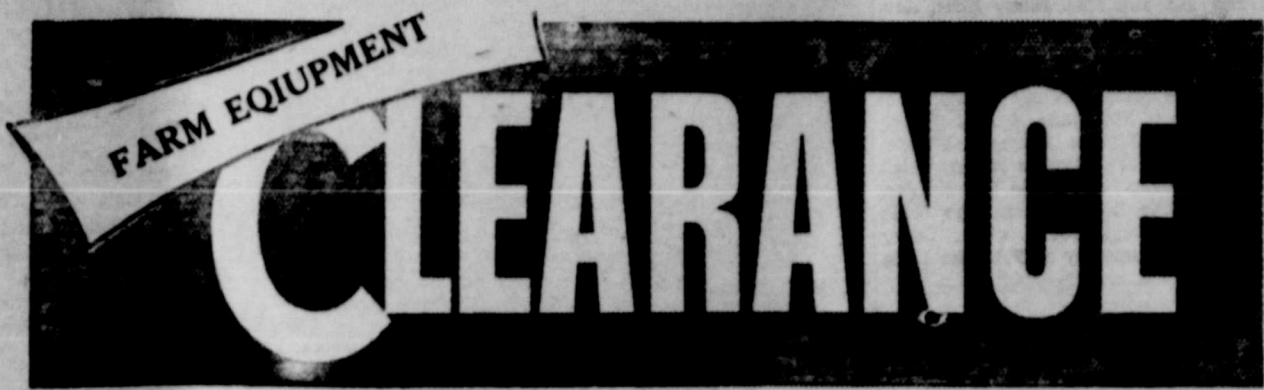

May Violations Show Big Lack Of Fish License

Despite continued warnings and reminders of old and new game laws, Texas fishermen topped the violations hit parade in May with that familiar old malady: fishing without a license.

The no-license charge was made against 113 reports E. M. Sprott, Director of Law Enforcement of the Game and Fish Commission. This figure was below April with 166 violations, while the previous month's report showed only 42.

The increase, the Director said, is due to a move to clamp down on violators of the new laws. Game wardens had previously issued warnings.

Runners up to the fishing license violations were pollution with 16 and trespassing with 13 violations.

The total game and fish law violations in May was 211, which added up to \$4,328.45 in fines and \$364 in court costs.
