

A solid carload of arsenic has been ordered by a group of Sweetwater business men in co-operation with the Board of City Development, for distribution to Nolan County farmers for staging active warfare against the grasshoppers in thi scounty. The drive against the pests will start early this year in an attempt to clean them out before serious damage is done the cotton crop.

The arsenic will be distributed to farmers at cost, selling for approximately 10c per lb., and representing a distinct savings over retail prices.

A carload of molasses has also been ordered, and this will also be sold at cost to the farmers. The molasses is mixed with arsenic and bran to make an effective grasshopper poison.




