#### Automobile for Lubbock.

Mr. Phelps White, the genial Yellow House manager, a Mr. Conrad from Amarillo and a Mr. Stollard from Roswell, surprised our people last Tuesday afternoon by riding into town in The trip an automobile. from the Yellow House ranch to Lubbock, a distance of 45 miles, was made in about three hours.




