Evelyn Cobb of the Progressive Study Club of Haskell was named as a Life Member of Mesquite District TFWC for her years of membership

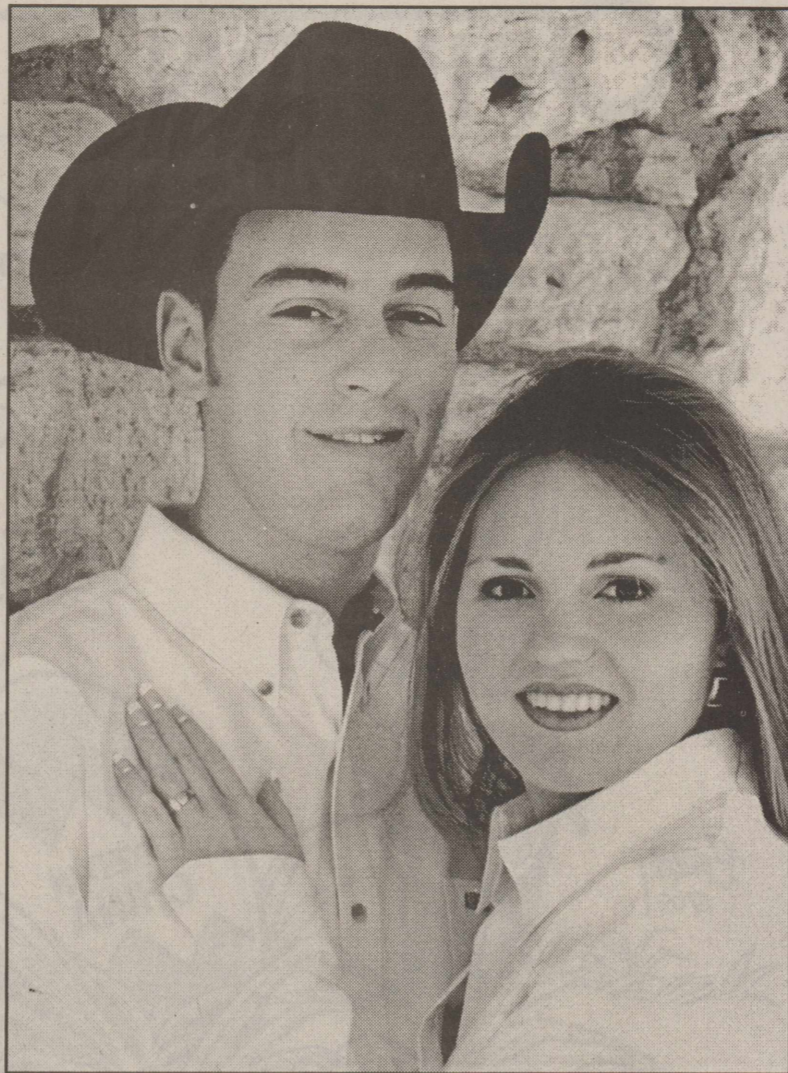
and service. Frances Lane and Thula Perry of the Haskell club were presented with 50 year membership awards.

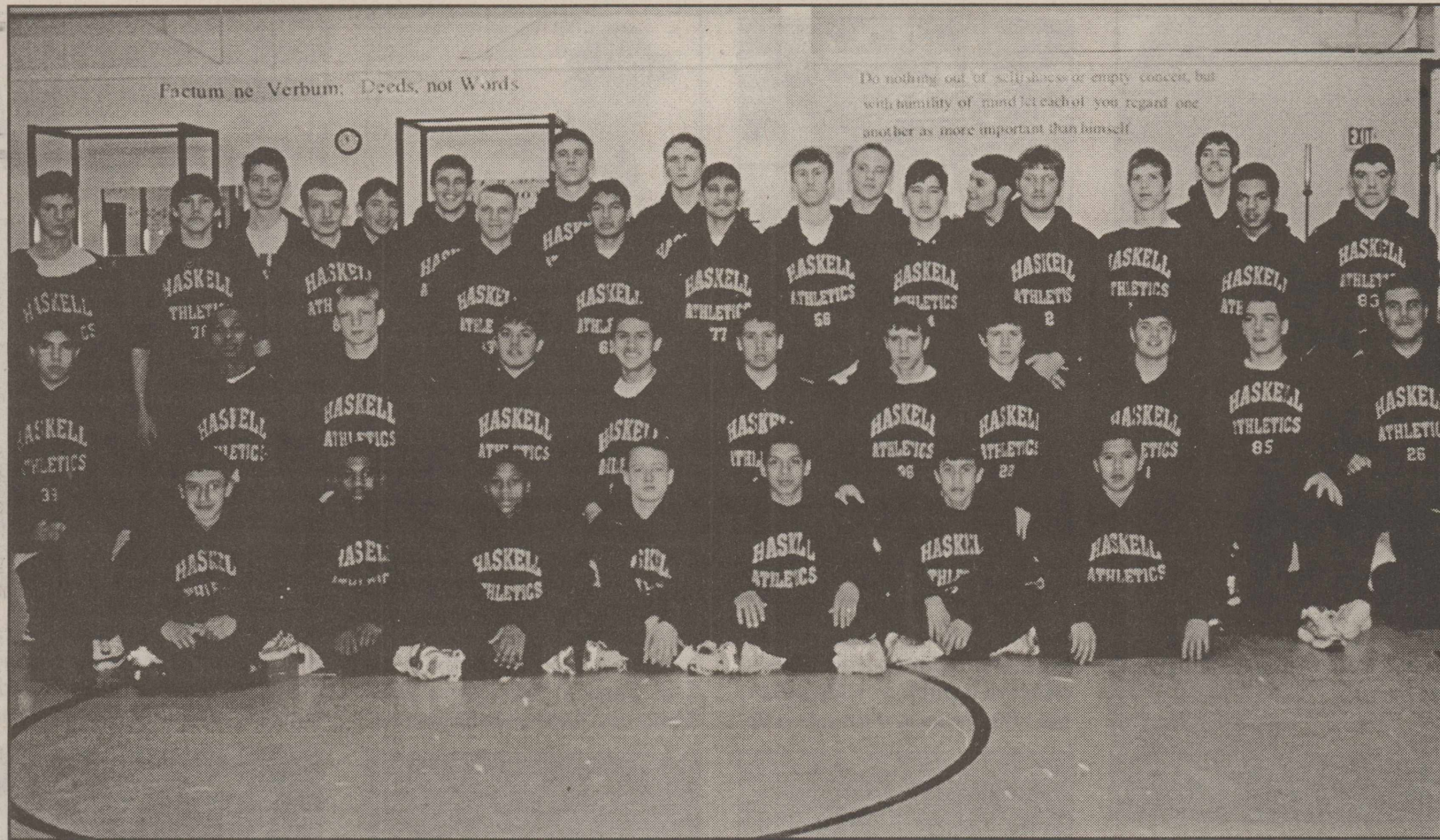

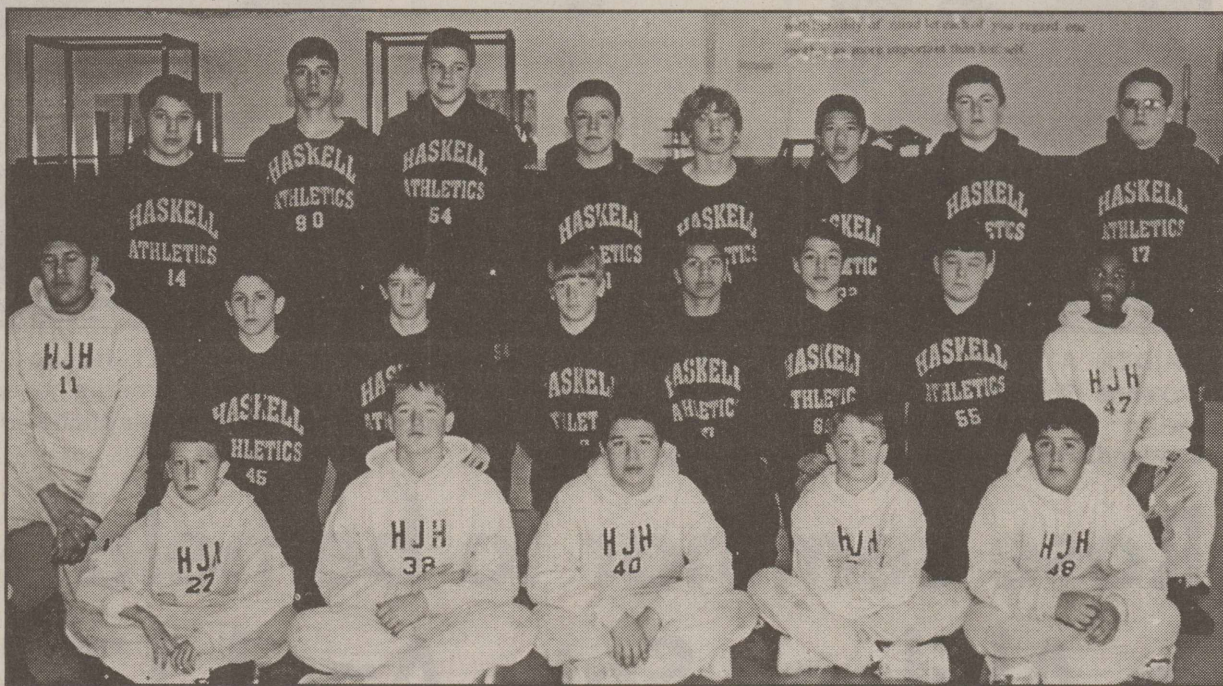

## Tips for cleaning with ease

When a house is clean, it makes you feel good. But, with hectic lifestyles and schedules, who feels up to cleaning? You will with help from these new forms of cleaning products that get cleaning done in a snap! Always read product label directions before using.

For bathroom stains:

•Bleach pens. These pen-like cleaning tools can quickly and easily remove mold and mildew on such surfaces as grout lines between wall or floor tiles. The products contain chlorine bleach in gel form. Use the pointed tip or broader scrubber end to apply bleach precisely where it's needed.

•Toilet bowl cleaners in tablet form. They deodorize as they clean. Drop these rapid-action tablets into the bowl, watch them dissolve into a froth of bubbles, then simply brush away stains.

•Toilet bowl cleaners in gel form. The gel clings to the sides of the bowl longer than liquid cleaner, making it particularly effective on tough stains, such as lime scale. Brush, then flush and the toilet bowl will be clean and fresh.

Zap dirt in dishwashers:

•Detergents in tablet form. The tablet is actually in two layers: a pre-soak that dissolves and removes dried food, and a detergent that cleans. Another version includes a sheeting agent, so glassware comes out shiny and spot-free.

•Detergents in gel form. Concentrated gels come in easy-pour bottles or in pre-measured pacs that dissolve completely. Light citrus scents are available, so dishes smell as clean as they look!

## Maintain Beneficials While Controlling Damaging Pecan Pests

A pecan orchard is a sensitive environment. Many chemical treatments for damaging pests like pecan nut casebearer and hickory shuckworm also eliminate beneficial insects and can potentially lead to outbreaks of aphids and other secondary pests. It's a delicate balance.

Field studies have shown that Intrepid® 2F insecticide is an effective way to control pecan nut casebearer and hickory shuckworm without harming the beneficial insects found in an orchard. Intrepid is an advanced, selective insecticide that provides 14- to 21-day residual activity against these target pests. Multiple generations of casebearers are common, with the first generation generally causing the most damage and potential economic loss.

Hickory shuckworms may be present in orchards throughout most of the season, but are generally seen in June or July. Prior to shell hardening, shuckworms feed inside nuts and cause the nut to drop. After shell hardening, the larvae feed in the pecan shuck and cause it to stick to the shell, making shellout more difficult and expensive after harvest.

Follow state scouting recommendations for determining egg lay and treatment thresholds for these pests. Intrepid may be applied at rates of 4-8 fluid ounces per acre in sequential treatments during the season or following a recommended early season treatment of Lorsban®-4E insecticide.

For casebearer control, apply Intrepid insecticide at the initiation of egg hatch for each generation. Control of first generation casebearer may require a second application under conditions of extended egg lay or for improved coverage of rapidly expanding nuts and foliage. The higher rates may be needed for extended residual effectiveness, higher pest infestations, low crop load, larger trees or heavy, dense foliage.

For shuckworm control, treat early- to mid-season infestations at egg hatch, with applications for late season infestations coming at half-shell hardening. Subsequent applications may be made at 14-day intervals to shuck split or while nuts are susceptible to heavy infestations.

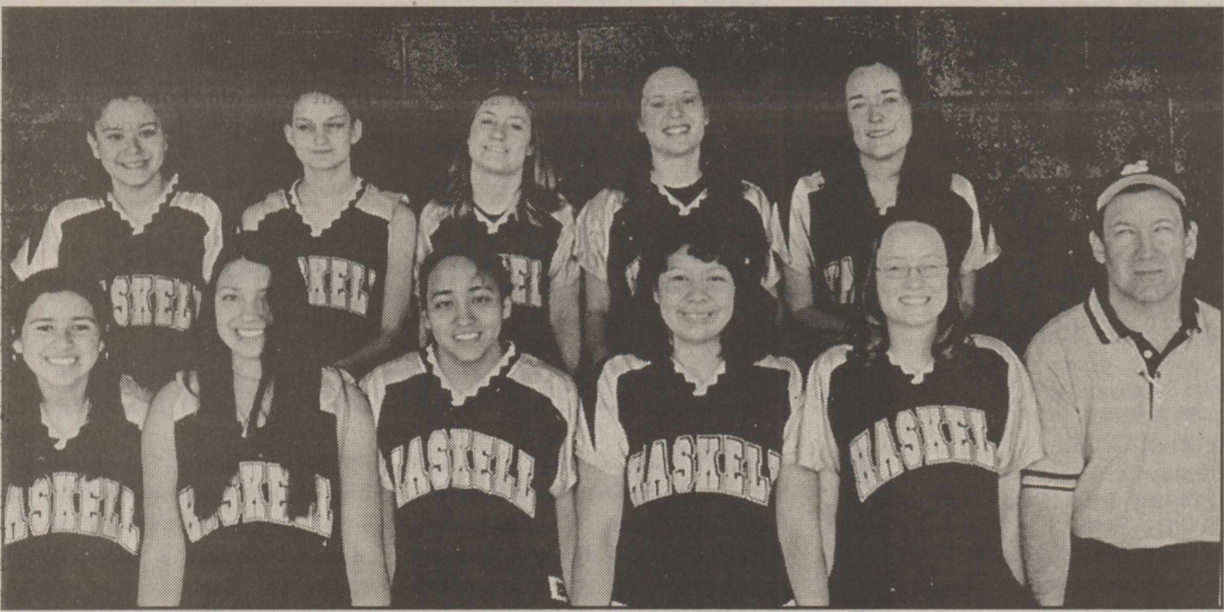

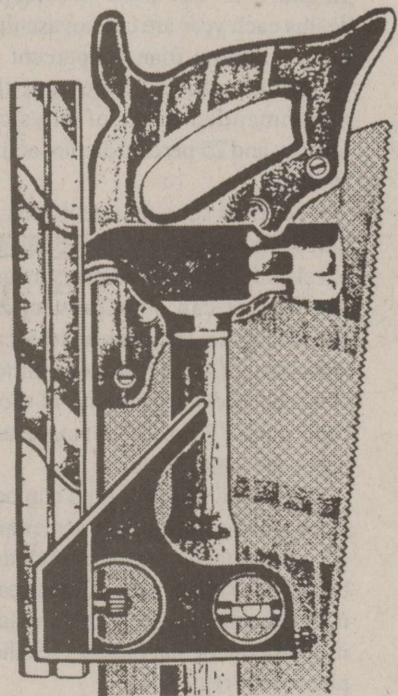
