

Statement by Officers of the Haskell Cemetery Association

The officers of the Haskell Cemetery Association believe that the public is entitled to a statement concerning the late unfortunate litigation and court suit involving the Association. On a number of occasions, the local newspaper quoted the style of the

Nothing could be further from the facts. For eight years, Mrs. Maples has served the Association with untiring devotion and with the highest Christian motives and integrity.

About three years ago some differences arose among the members of the association concerning the management of its internal affairs. Some members objected to some of the policies of the officers of the association. Finally such differences resulted in two sets of officers, each claiming to be the officers of the Haskell Cemetery Association, and a suit was filed in the District Court styled as above set out.
