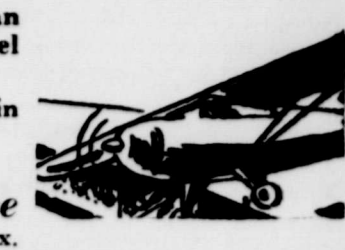

## They Work, They Buy, They Leave

Several thousand cotton pickers are temporary residents of Haskell County during this section's busiest season every year, and these people are worth much more to Haskell County merchants than most disinterested observers believe. There are many local folks who think the farm laborers are in here for a few thousand fast dollars who take most of this money back to South Texas and Old Mexico with them.

A few minutes in almost any Haskell business establishment on any Saturday will convince even the most critical that the people who gather Haskell County's crops every fall are worth more to the businesses of this section than a casual thought would indicate. Usually the cotton pickers come here during warm weather and stay until cold weather has hit, and they don't bring along enough clothes to ward off Old Man Winter. Dry goods stores sell thousands of dollars worth of clothing and bedding material; hardware stores sell them great quantities of small implements and other supplies that go with camping, cooking, working and living in the open; grocery stores sell them food in orders that run quickly into hundreds of dollars every week; drug stores sell them medicines and other items that are required by anyone in normal everyday living; garages and filling stations profit by supplying gas and oil, tires, automotive equipment and service; cafes do business in big volume with them; theatres entertain hundreds of these workers every week; and other businesses make money supplying needs of folks who make good money and are ready to spend it.

Several years ago there were people who came to this section during harvest season who were of questionable character. Let us not penalize those who come here now by classifying them with former transient laborers. Most of the workers who gather Haskell County crops now are of unquestionable character, and are so organized in groups that they are highly efficient and are easy for farmers to deal with. They are intelligent and clean and establish friendships here that last through the years. Many groups return year after year to work for the same farmers. They truly are an asset to Haskell County.

## Navy Hero Trains For Ministry

Wilfred M. Bailey, 22, one of the 1,000 students attending Southern Methodist University in Dallas under the VA educational program, has put aside his flying gear and Navy Cross to train for the ministry.

The stocky Texan was awarded the Navy decoration for his part in sinking a Jap aircraft carrier during the second battle of the Philippine Sea.

"I suppose," he said, "that becoming a minister always has been my plan. But it didn't completely formulate itself in my mind until I got out there above the Pacific. Seeing my comrades' names disappear from the roster, one by one, had something to do with it."

## WAA Official Plans Abilene Visit

ABILENE, Tex.—First of two visits to be made to Abilene during November on behalf of World War II veterans interested in obtaining surplus property from War Assets Administration will be on Wednesday and Thursday Nov. 13 and 14. John P. Kelly, Ft. Worth, will be at the American Legion Hall, 1st and Cedar Sts., from 9 to 1 and 2 to 5.

Kelly stated that veterans of this part of Texas who have not previously applied for certification should do so at this time. He pointed out that two huge "site sales" of tremendous quantities of surplus goods in which veterans will be able to exercise their priority buying rights are now being prepared.

The first of these "site sales" will open at the Fort Worth quartermaster depot late in November and another big "site sale"

Since no certification is done at "site sales" veterans should plan now to present their discharge to Kelly during his Abilene visit and complete the necessary paper work so that they will be eligible to make any desired purchases at either of the site sales soon to be held.

Another visit will be made to Abilene Nov. 27 but Kelly stated that this would be too late to permit veterans to obtain certification in time to participate in either of the "site sales" now being made ready for opening.

WAA hasn't been issuing any certificates for typewriters since May 31—this chance to be certified is a change in policy and will last only until Dec. 1.

Other items on the veteran set aside list, like typewriters for exclusive sale to veterans, include office furniture, wrist watches, sleeping bags and other hard-to-get items, on which certificates are now available.

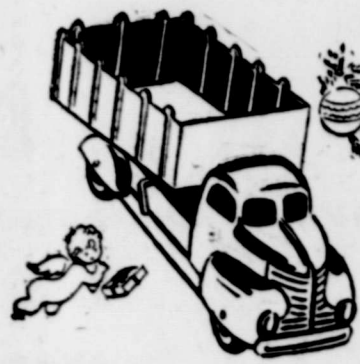

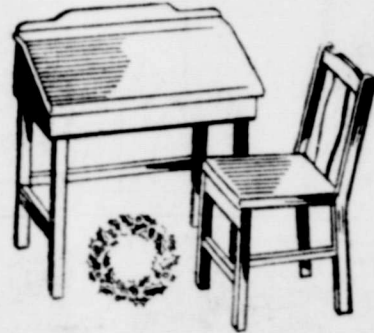

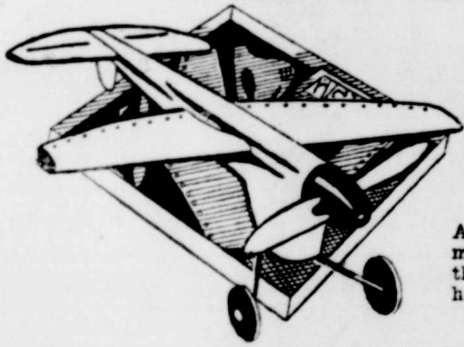
