The Council of the City have passed an ordinance providing for a weekly clearing up of the city from the middle of April to the middle of October.

Every person occupying any lot is required on each Friday evening to clear up his premises and the half of the street in front of his ground, and place all the accumulations in barrels or boxes on the side of the street, from which on Saturday morning the Marshal will have them removed to proper places.

The Council have passed for one year the building next to Capt. Bohner's residence on Second street, in which that body meet, and where also the Mayor, Recorder, Marshal, Assessor and City Surveyor will keep their offices.

To F. Deane.—We will be pleased to comply with your wishes. It is ever pleasing to do a public good.

The City Council, it will be seen, in ordering an assessment of property, have provided for taking the census, showing the number of white males and females, slaves, free persons of color, whole number of buildings and the number erected since last January, 1852.

This, we think, a wise provision, as it will place the council in possession of reliable data upon which to act in laying taxes, show the whole value of the property in the city and the relative improvement since the beginning of last year, a period of fifteen months.

The population of Indianola has never been correctly taken or known-it is now very roughly estimated at from one thousand to twelve and fifty hundred.

Should it amount to one thousand only, it shows an increase of 1849, and of one hundred per cent, since the State census of 1851. The actual increase of wealth, capital and business has been much greater.

A rough estimate of the value of improved real estate, made by one of our assessors upon imperfect data, shows an aggregate of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars.

We presume the amount, upon a careful assessment, will reach fully three hundred thousand, if not considerably more.

The assessment will officially demonstrate an undeniable and encouraging fact, that the growth of Indianola has been without a parallel in Western Texas.

EDUCATION.—No people can be truly great without education. In Republican Governments this is eminently true.

Our young State, but very large in territory; she possesses a great variety of climate, from 20 to 35 degrees north latitude; she enjoys peculiar advantages of soil, climate and productions; she is just emerging into a happy and prosperous condition, after a long and eventful career of misfortunes and casualties, which held her back and diverted her youthful energies to measures of immediate preservation, rather than of progressive advancement.

We have ventured to term her the Empire State of the South, a significant and honorable distinction if legitimately won and retained.

We maintain, then, that to insure a bright and happy future for our State, the cause of education must be advanced and encouraged by all proper means—by the people, by societies and churches, and by the State government.

Knowledge, learned with high moral principles, must be diffused among the people—among the working classes, the masses of every well regulated free government.

The means of acquiring this boon must be placed within the reach of all. By an early interest in the subject, our legislature may lay the foundation upon which to build up a system of schools for the masses, that shall shed its beneficent rays throughout the land.

We should desire that legislator who would devise a really practical system, carrying out this object, so that the children of every man in Texas, whether rich or poor, native or foreign, could receive a liberal and moral English education, as worthy of the plaudits of every good citizen.

We should place him high in the niche of fame, to be remembered and honored by the generations to come after him.

It is to be hoped that our public men will take this great question home to themselves and give it that grave and solemn, (may we not say prayerful) consideration which its vast importance demands.

The State has the means—that is a settled point. The great trouble is to devise the plan—one that shall be adapted to the situation of the State and possess the harmony and symmetry necessary to a permanent self-sustaining existence.

The State should, through a competent agent, avail herself of the experience of other States, as Connecticut, Massachusetts and Michigan, on the subject. Thus we might avoid much trouble and confusion and at once proceed to adopt the best form.

THE SEVERITY OF TEXAS.—For many years, the situation of a large number of the land titles in Texas has been one of doubt and conflict. The people have anxiously awaited the decision of the Supreme Court in several leading cases, as forming an index to general principles involved.

The late session of the court did considerable in this way, deciding several old cases of much importance; at the previous term, also, important cases were disposed of, one touching eleven league cases, another the San Antonio case, another that involving four leagues on the Medina; the cases of Holliman's heirs vs. Peckles, Horton vs. Horton and others, decided some years ago with the decisions of this and last winter, will go far towards settling general principles in our land titles, and enabling the people to know good from bad titles.

No less than five important cases were decided this term from this and Victoria county, the Tax title, the Lat title between Moody and Wheeler, the Indian title, the Port Lavaca case, and the League case between Stinson and Blair et al. There are but one or two cases now, or likely to be, in suit from this portion of the country, perhaps that of Chambers against Sigler, Jones & Borker vs. White et al., and the issue between Powers' heirs and the State, relative to St. Joseph's Island, are the only ones undecided.

We cherish these facts with great pleasure, that it may be seen, our land titles are becoming free from the embarrassments, heretofore hanging over them. We trust in a year or two more there will be no disputed titles in this portion of the country.

We are not sufficiently posted in the questions decided to state them as would be desirable, otherwise it might be interesting to our readers to have it done.

LETTER FROM HALLETSVILLE. HALLETSVILLE, TEXAS, March 28, 1853. Messrs. Brown & Bond:—In the correspondence I propose to give you a correct statement of the advantages and progress of our country and town.

That Lavaca county contains a large quantity of fertile soil, and our country has ever yielded a surplus of wheat, corn, &c. It is a fact in which you will be well supplied with timber than almost any county in Western Texas. It is one of the best watered counties in the whole State. I can not find three more healthy counties in the State which possesses so many beautiful streams as Lavaca. All these advantages, make it one of the best farming localities in Western Texas. It is rather better adapted to farming than any other. A country possessing such fertility of soil, so much good timber and such abundance of good water, is certainly destined soon to be densely populated by good citizens. Many good citizens and capitalists have lately emigrated to the county.

Hallettsville, the new county seat, is rapidly improving, and is destined to become one of the finest and most populous inland towns in Texas. Some beautiful buildings have lately been erected, and several others will be erected during the spring and summer. Among the fine buildings to be erected in the course of the coming year, is a new court house. The jail will be completed about the 1st July next, and the courthouse about the 1st October. L. W. Larson is doing well for the property of Hallettsville, and has lately constructed a very fine academy in the town. The wagon bridge, which is really splendid, is quite a beautiful and important structure. It is most beautifully painted, the work having been executed by one of the finest and most skillful artists in Texas. The painting and ornamental work was executed by Mr. Samuel Dickson, of La Grange. Mr. D. is a gentleman of a great skill, having been formerly bred in his profession in London.
