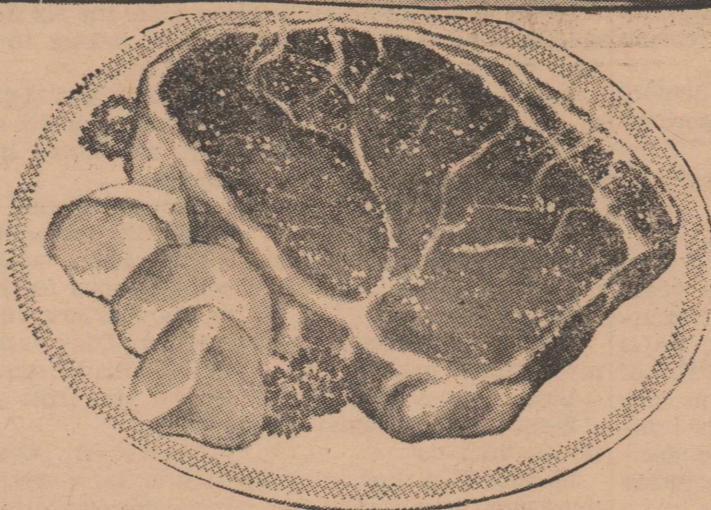

The state has been districted and one or more directors assigned each district according to the total pound of mohair produced in the counties composing the district. Crockett county has been placed in District 3, composed of Crockett, Reagan, Upton and Crane counties, with a total mohair production of 879,113 pounds. The district will be entitled to one director on the Council.

WOMAN'S CLUB MEETS

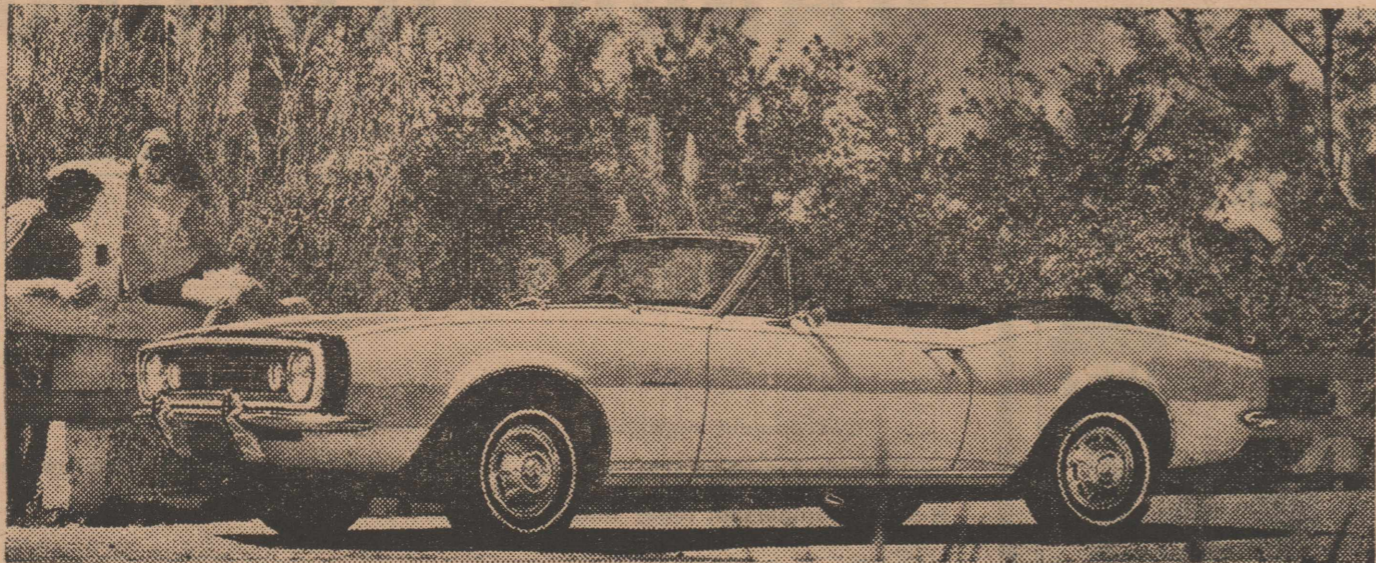

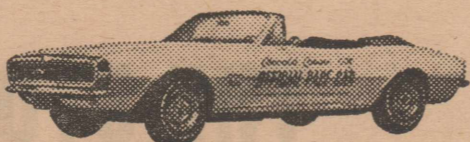
