

THE MESSAGE IS CLEAR

On August, 20, 1968, the dream bridge between Washington and Moscow fell

The issue of the Soviet tensions between Czechoslonewspaper Pravda for that vakia and the Soviet Union date, published prior to the invasion of Czechoslovakia said: "Marxists - Leninists are not and can never be indifferent to the fate of socialist construction in other countries and the general cause of socialism and Communism on earth. . . no one will ever be allowed to drive a wedge between the socialist states or undermine the foundation of the socialist structure. The fraternal parties consider it their obligation to insure that imperialist intrigues are nipped in the bud and to strengthen the unity of socialist commonwealth, and all revolutionary forces."

Only hours after that appeared in print, Radio Prague was announcing that "troops of the Soviet Union, Polish People's Republic, the G. D. R. (East Germany) the Hungarian People's Republic and the Bulgarian People's Republic (have) crossed the frontiers of the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic."
