





2 large carrots sliced diagonally in 1-inch pieces

Trim excess fat from chops and fry out in a heavy skillet. Skim out the fat pieces when they are brown. Brown chops well in the fat on both sides. Remove to a medium casserole that will hold them in one layer. Salt lightly. In the fat remaining in the skillet, brown the raw rice, stirring constantly until it is colored. Stir in the consomme. Arrange the onions and carrots around the chops in the casserole, salt lightly, and pour the riceconsomme mixture over. Cover and bake 1 hour in a 350-degree oven. Serves 4.
