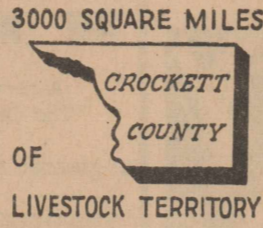

W. M. Day, Jr., county agent at Rankin, will be the show judge.

Show superintendents are J. C. Schroeder, Alfred Allee, Jr., and Sonny Henderson.

The 4-H Barn Committee consist of R. J. Everett, Jr., and Bill Crawford. Auction sale clerk committee members are Martha Henderson, Jan Allee, Pat Cain and Debra Gentry.

The 4-H Consession Stand Committee will be all mothers of 4-H livestock feeders with Mrs. J. C. Schroeder as chairman.

The 4-H Show Committee consist of Sonny Henderson, R. J. Everett, Jr., Lorelie McMullan, Eddie Hale and J. C. Schroeder.

All lambs will be weighed into the Barn on Friday afternoon, January 19th. Judging of livestock starts at 9:00 a.m. on the 20th. A benefit barbecue will be served at noon.

Presentation of show awards will be made at 1:30 p.m., followed by a livestock auction sale at 2:00 p.m.

D.P.S. Predicts 87 May Die In Texas Accidents

Colonel Wilson E. Speir, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, today asked motorists and pedestrians to help prevent an estimated 87 traffic deaths in Texas through the Christmas and New Year holiday periods. Speir said the DPS has estimated 46 traffic fatalities will occur during the Christmas period which runs from 6 p.m. Friday, December 22 to midnight Monday, December 25.

The DPS director noted that many serious accidents can be prevented if drivers and pedestrians will practice safety awareness during the holidays. Record 455 Million Cubic Feet Of Gas Per Day For Crockett Well

Crockett County gained one of its most prolific gas producers on record when the Miller (Ellenburger) field of southeast Crockett County gained its fourth producer and a 3/4 mile north and one-mile east extension with completion of HNG Oil Co., Midland, No. 1-10 Miller Ranch, 25 miles south of Ozona, for a calculated, absolute open flow of 455 million cubic feet of gas per day, with gas-liquid ratio of 100,000-1.

Santa To Make Pre-Christmas Visit Tomorrow

Santa Claus will arrive in Ozona tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock. His schedule calls for arrival at the airport by plane shortly before 2 p.m. He will be brought into town by the Ozona Volunteer Fire Department whose members will furnish the new red truck for Santa's use. He will make a circle around the park, throwing candy to the children and then set up shop between the court house and the annex to visit with children individually. Each child will receive a bag of candy from Santa, courtesy of the fire department.

The street will be roped off for Santa's visit and parents are asked to form a line with their children in order that Santa may see all the children before he returns to the North Pole.

10-Day School Holiday Period Begins Tomorrow

Ozona schools will be dismissed tomorrow afternoon for the holiday period. Teachers will return to school Jan. 2, 1973 for a day of in-service training, and children will return Jan. 3 when regular classes will be resumed.

Both elementary schools will dismiss at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon in order that the younger children may get to the park for Santa's visit.

Junior high and high school will dismiss at 2:30. Final examinations have been in progress all week at high school and most students will be dismissed following their final exam.

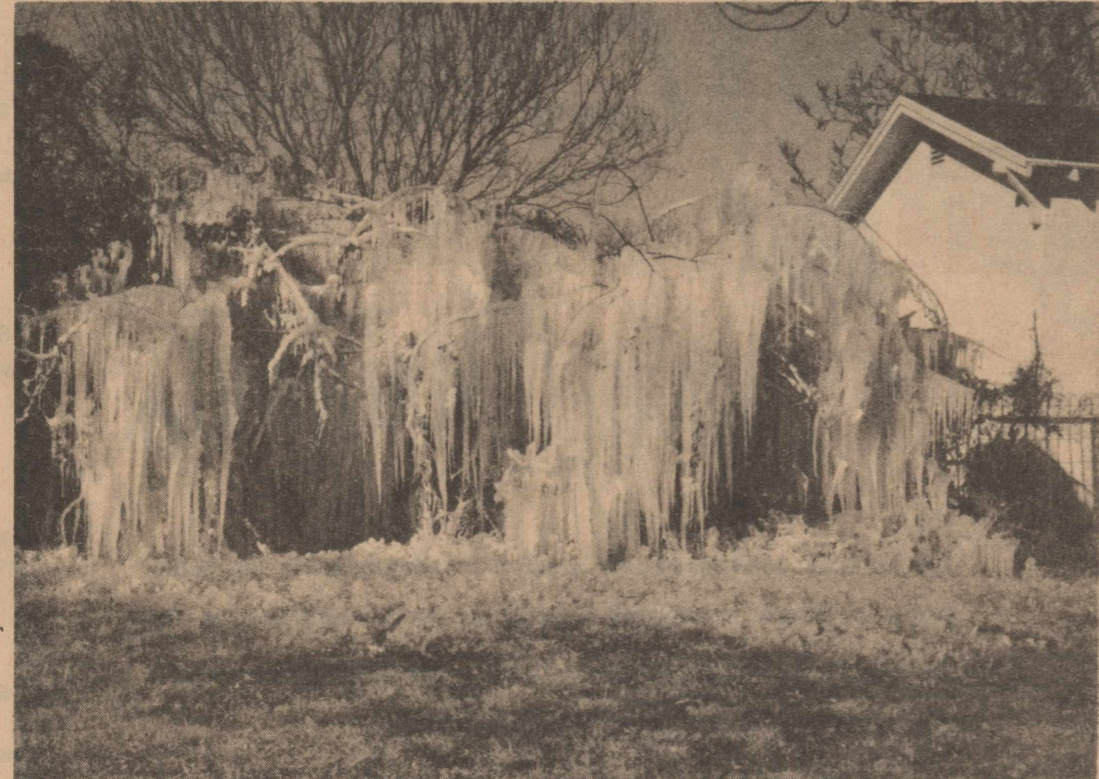

prevent fatigue.

In an effort to keep expected heavy traffic flowing smoothly during both holiday weekends, the Department of Public Safety will place all available patrolmen on the highways. And Speir said they will be keeping a close watch for motorists who drive too fast for conditions and those under the influence of alcohol.

In addition to stepped up enforcement activities, the DPS, local law enforcement

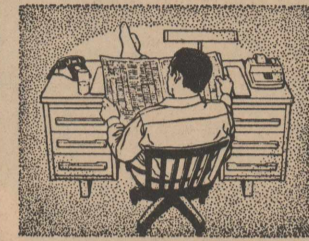
29 years ago

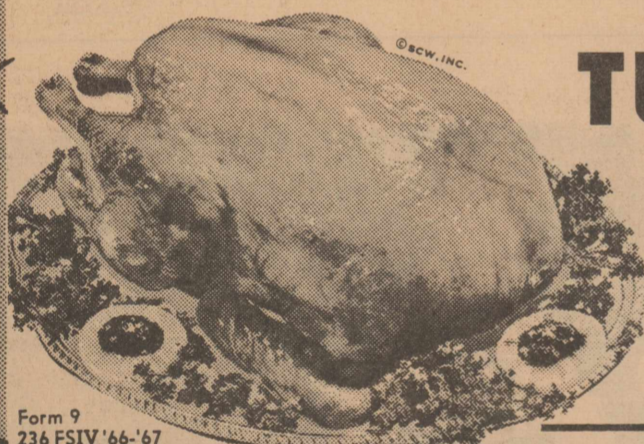

A low level of alcohol in the blood, such as would result from taking one drink an hour, has a mild tranquilizing effect, since alcohol is a central nervous system depressant. It may at first seem to stimulate you, however. Through evolutionary development the brain consists of many layers, and alcohol's first effects will be exerted upon the upper,

or "newer," parts of the brain where learned behavior patterns such as self-control are stored. After a drink or two, this learned behavior may temporarily disappear, making you lose your inhibitions, talk more freely, or feel like the "life of the party." Or you may feel aggressive, or depressed.

Higher blood alcohol levels depress brain activity further to a point that memory, as well as muscular coordination and balance, may be temporarily impaired. Still larger alcohol intake within a relatively short period of time depresses deeper parts of the brain, producing a state

of loss of control in which judgment is severely affected, and sensory perceptions are dulled.

If steady heavy drinking continues, the alcohol will anesthetize the deepest levels of the brain, and may result in coma, or death.
