

Crockett County gained one of its most prolific gas producers on record when the Miller (Ellenburger) field of southeast Crockett County gained its fourth producer and a 3/4 mile north and one-mile east extension with completion of HNG Oil Co., Midland, No. 1-10 Miller Ranch, 25 miles south of Ozona, for a calculated, absolute open flow of 455 million cubic feet of gas per day, with gas-liquid ratio of 100,000-1.

**D.P.S. Predicts** 87 May Die In **Texas Accidents** 

Colonel Wilson E. Speir, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety. today asked motorists and pedestrians to help prevent an estimated 87 traffic deaths in Texas through the Christmas and New Year holiday periods.

Speir said the DPS has estimated 46 traffic fatalities will occur during the Christmas period which runs from 6 p.m. Friday, December 22 to midnight Monday, December 25.

We think more about what we can do for somebody, rather than what we can do to somebody.







## Alcohol Abuse, **2nd In Series**

When you drink an alcoholic beverage, 20 per cent of the alcohol in it is absorbed directly and immediately into the bloodstream through the stomach walls. Unlike other "food, " it does not have to be digested. The blood carries it directly to the brain where the alcohol acts on the brain's central control areas, slowing down or depressing brain activity. The other 80 per cent

of alcohol is processed only slightly slower through the gastrointestinal tract and into the bloodstream. Alcohol is in such a rush to get into the bloodstream that moments after it is consumed it can be found in all tissues, organs, and secretions of the body. sult from taking one drink an hour, has a mild tranquilizing effect, since alcohol is a central nervous system depressant. It may at first seem to stimulate you, however. Through evolutionary development the brain consists of many layers, and alcohol's first effects will
