Can They Handle It?
The question of handling this year's great crop is becoming a serious one, it seems, to the railroads. The Kansas City Journal quotes a prominent railroad official as saying that the freight car equipment of the Western roads will be totally inadequate for moving the immense corn crop alone.

The Flight of Gold.
The Memphis Commercial-appeal in a spirit of facetiousness tells some very pertinent truths thus: "The gold standard financiers are sorely puzzled over the reprehensible behavior of their favorite metal. The continued and persistent flight of gold after everything has been done to make home pleasant for it, is a sore trial upon those who have made such promises of good conduct for it. We were assured that gold was so hostile to silver that it would not abide with it in the same house; and congress thereupon proceeded to banish silver from the mints in order that gold might not be annoyed by the presence of such plebeian-society. We were promised that with the repeal of the Sherman act we would not only keep all the gold we had, but that additional supplies would seek us from every part of the world. It was the Sherman act that was driving all the gold out of the country. The Sherman act was repealed. The gold standard was lifted up. The despised silver was banished from the mints. Gold's great enemy was driven from the field. The effect has been to accelerate the flight of gold. Three times has the government issued bonds to entice the fugitive back to our shores. It has increased the permanent debt of the country \$165,000,000. At last, in its desperation it placed the treasury under the protection of a foreign and domestic syndicate pledged for a limited time to protect it against the demand of note-holders, the consideration being a sale to the syndicate of United States bonds at about 18 cents on the dollar less than their market value. Yet in spite of all these strenuous efforts, the export of gold has continued and increased. It has been larger since the repeal of the Sherman act than it was before. The amount of gold exports during the past twenty months is unprecedented, is a statement that mild ly tells the truth of the whole business.
