Daughters of the Republic of Texas.

HOUSTON, TEXAS, Feb. 2, 1898.
 County Superintendent of Public Schools:

DEAR SIR: Wishing the children of Texas to love and reverence the faces of the heroes who created our great commonwealth, the Daughters of the Republic of Texas have determined to present to such public schools [white] as will frame and properly care for them, portraits of two of the men noted in our history, General Stephen F. Austin and General Sam Houston.

In order to gain large reductions in prices it is deemed feasible to place the framing of the whole number with one firm, and to order through one channel; therefore bids have been submitted by different houses, and it is ascertained that two dollars will cover the expense of farming and packing and freight of the two pictures for each school. The portraits are lithographs and are 21x26 inches in size; the frames will be of imitation oak, three inches in width.

Please make this offer known to the principal of schools in your county, asking them to communicate with the chairman of undersigned committee if this offer be accepted. Orders accompanied by necessary amount and address will receive prompt attention.

It is suggested that the portrait of General Austin be presented on Independence Day, March the Second, and that of General Houston on San Jacinto Day, April the Twenty first, with appropriate exercises; and there will appear in the February and March numbers of The Texas Magazine at Dallas, programs embracing this idea.

"Dixie" as a National Song.
 The Washington (D. C.) Friend at Court:

This dear old song, which has given its author, Daniel Decatur Emmett, imperishable fame, has become so thoroughly identified with one section of our country that it may be doubted whether or not it is entitled to be classed among our national songs; but it is confidently asserted that, had it not been for the divisions created by the great war, it would have been as popular in the North today as it is in the South, since it first came out North and achieved an almost instantaneous popularity there—the boys taking it up on the streets—and there would have been no occasion for its diminished favor in that section but for its adoption in the South. It must be generally conceded, whether it is sectional or not, that there are but few songs which have more power to move a popular audience in any geographical section of our country than has this soul-stirring melody.

"Dixie" was taken up and adopted by the South, and Dixie's land and the South have become synonymousterms the world over. That is as Mr. Emmett intended it should be; he meant by "Dixie," the land of the South, according to his own testimony. He says that negro minstrelsy in the day in which "Dixie" was written, the spring of 1859, always carried with it an idea of the South, and that he meant the South when writing the word "Dixie," which he clearly indicated by the words "the land of cotton, and other expressions of similar geographical coloring. Mr. Emmett also wrote another song which became exceedingly popular throughout the country: "Old Dan Tucker;" but "Dixie," which has power to raise a Southern audience to its feet anywhere and to cause a stir of enthusiasm among any people, is perhaps the most lively and inspiring air that the musical world has ever known.


