"Dear Sir: "I am giving you below a statement showing the amount of savings to the people of your city, due to the 'Good Fire Record Credit' and the fifteen (15) per cent reduction under Amendment No. 111, to the General Basis Schedules, which reduction became effective February 1,, 1921.
