## Lightning Flash Pictures Body

MOVIE SCENARIO BASED ON MYSTERIOUS MIRROR

One of the most unusual phenomena of the age will be on display at the Majestice Theatre December 13, when J. G. Kearby will present the much talked about "mysterious mirror."

This mirror which bears the image of the shrouded body of a woman, formerly hung in a negro cabin near Marshall, Texas. It was in this cabin on the night of May 8, 1918, that the phenomenon occurred which has then baffling the scientific world ever since. On that night a severe electrical storm took place and during the disturbance a flash of lighthing caused the room in which the body of the dead woman lay to light up with a peculiar brilliancy. In the morning the image of the woman was visible in the glass,

That some peculiar electrical force in the atmosphere caused by the lightning caused the mirror to act as a photographic plate is the opinion which has been advanced by several leading scientists and by the present owner of the mirror. However other leading scientists and electrical authorities have hesitated in admitting that lightning could have affected the glass in such a manner, and their hesitancy is due to the fact that it refutes so many long accepted






