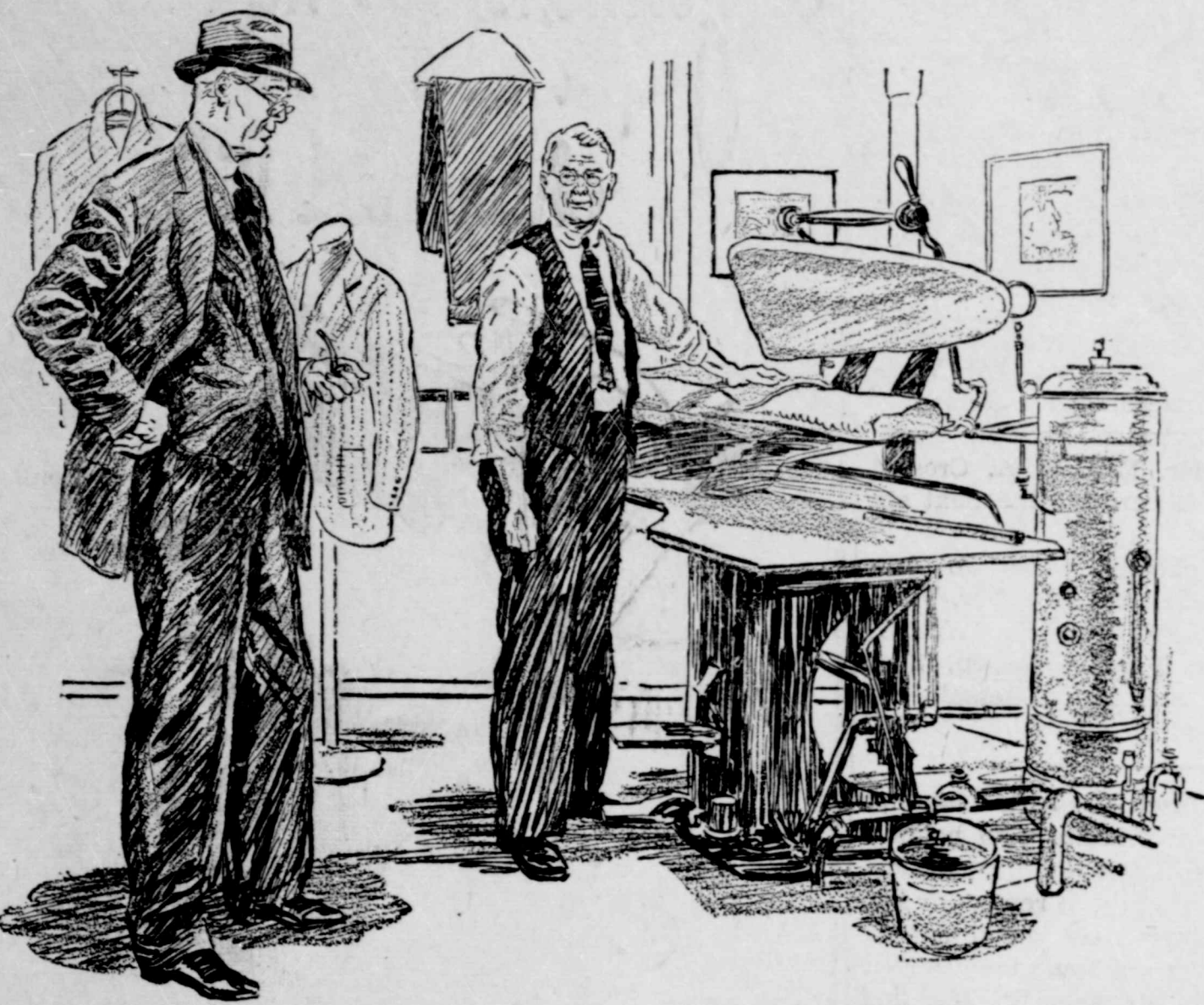

Mrs. Swan gave an interesting talk on juvenile delinquency and Mrs. Kelly gave points on how to get rid of insects on poultry.

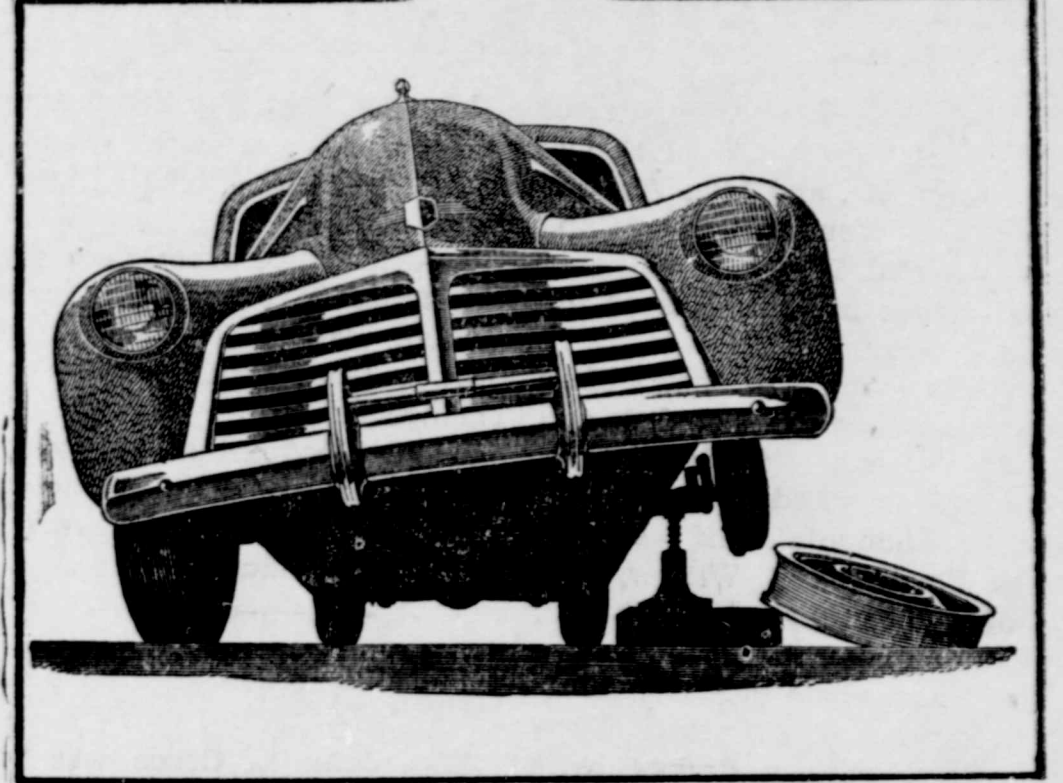
Miss Reast could not be present at this meeting as this was her regular meeting time with our club, but will be present when the club meets April 27th with Mrs. A. B. Buchanan.
