Two Counsel in Contempt.

The trial and confinement of the great New York ring-leader has been a matter of profound interest to the whole country as showing the final triumph of justice over the most powerful and corrupt conspiracy that has ever been organized, and which had become confident of its ability to set the laws at defiance from its success for years in swindling the people of New York out of many millions. But the great efforts made by the leader of this corrupt ring to escape punishment cannot be fully understood without a knowledge of the extraordinary steps taken by the able counsel to obtain a new trial. For this purpose they drew up a protest in which they undertook to show that the Judge (Davis) was disqualified to try the criminals.

1. Because he had previously expressed a decided opinion unfavorable to the prisoner, and had not charged the jury but to be influenced by said opinion.

2. Because under the law, as it existed before the late act of the Legislature, any person would be disqualified to act as trier who had assumed the position Judge Davis had done in relation to his defendant, and they also said that what would have disqualified a trier under the former law must disqualify a Judge now.

3. Because most of the questions of law that will be introduced in a new trial had already been decided by the Judge adversely to the defendant, and they claimed that it was in violation of the spirit of the present constitution for the Judge to sit in review of his decisions.

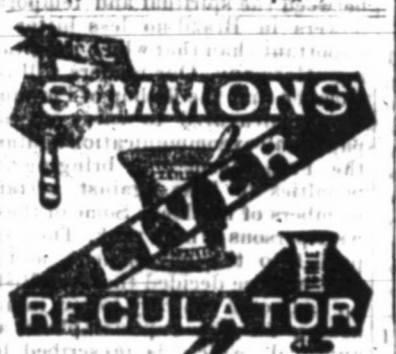
The protest concludes as follows:
 "The objection to a Judge who has already formed an opinion on a case is more apparent from the fact that in many States, where Jurors are Judges of law as well as facts, he would be absolutely disqualified as a juror."

The counsel strongly disclaimed any intentional disrespect to the Judge or the court, and declared their only purpose to be to resist professionally the current prejudices against their client. We give the reply of the Judge as a matter of interest to the public as much as to the legal profession, and we doubt not the fairness of the Judge in resisting this attempt to screen a notorious criminal from the just penalty of the law will meet with applause everywhere as it did in New York.

In reply Judge Davis said it was difficult to disambiguate the case from the suspicion of personal motives, but he disclaimed being governed by such, and said that had the paper been handed him privately, out of court, he should have paid no attention to it; but as it was handed to the Presiding Justice of the Court of Oyer and Terminer, it required attention. He commented at length on the paper, degrading that he had expressed any such bias as to disqualify him from sitting in the case. The paper charged that he had expressed an unqualified opinion on the facts. He cited his own charge to show that, while he had an opinion, and would be ashamed not to have one, he had not stated what that opinion was. Though that was the fact it mattered very little, for it was well settled that a Judge might express an opinion. It was charged that he had not charged the jury who were not to be influenced by his opinion. Some little censure to this was given by their own stenographic report, but that, equally with the court stenographer's report, showed that he had anxiously impressed on the jury their responsibility and their duty in judging on the facts. Again, said the Judge, it had taken some position to the case unfitting him to form a jury. It would be extraordinary if, in going through such a trial, a Judge did not form an opinion on the law and facts. If that was what was meant it should have been so expressed. But still more objectionable was the following: "Any person who had assumed the position toward the defendant, such as the Judge has assumed, is disqualified," etc. If it was intended to impute any improper re-

lation to the defendant, there was no foundation for such an assertion. He recalled the demand of the counsel for triers, and that the Court take the triers' oath, thus raising properly the constitutional question; but this paper undertook to say that the Judge was unfit to sit, by reason of the new duties imposed on him. The reason that because he had passed on the questions of law, his sitting to re-try the case, was a violation of the constitutional provision, forbidding a Judge to sit in appeal on his own decisions, was absurd and impertinent. There was nothing to support it. He discussed briefly the difference between this proceeding and the orderly formal transfer of cases in Wisconsin, and from State of United States courts before the trial was reached. He then concludes as follows:
