NEW ORLEANS, May 21 .- Hon. Frank Morey asks by telegraph from Washington, when is it estimated present supply of food and funds will be exhausted at the pre sent rate of distribution. Govermittee for Louisiana receive from thought by some that Newton's Government 8,000 rations daily, course will divide the Governor's and distribute from 30,000 to 40,000. Funds from private contributions Every effort is being made, by send-ing cotton seed, seed corn and rice to the overflowed districts to afford relief in the shape of work, and disconrage idlers; but necessities for help will last much longer than present resources.

CHICAGO, May 21. - Tobey & Booth's packing house, with a large number of dressed bogs, over a million pounds of bulk meats, several thousand pounds of lard, and six hundred live bogs, were burned last night. Loss estimated at \$150,000; insured.

ATLANTA, May 21.-The Confederate Surgeons' Convention elected Surgeon General P. Moore permanent President, Dr. H. Campbell Vice President at Large. The med-ical officers of the late Confederate States army and the naval medical officers of the United States army and navy who resigned to join the Confederate service were made honorary Vice Presidents. A commitmittee of three was appointed to confer with the Surgeon General of the United States army relative to the archives of the medical department of the Confederacy.

The records of the medical directors of the army of Tennessee and the Western army were tendered the association.

MADRID, May 21 .- A fight took place in the province of Tarrogona to alay, between a force of Republicans and a body of Carlists, resultfug in the defeat of the latter. The Insurgents bad sixty killed and many wounded. The causualties to the Republicans were five killed and ninety wounded.

A body of Carlists in Catalonia, numbering two hundred men, have been defeated by the National troops. Their loss was twenty-one killed and fourteen prisoners.

WASHINGTON, May 21. - In the Senate Senator Tipton has given notice of his intention to move an amendment to the deficiency bill, to appropriate \$25,000 for the subsistence, etc., of the Kickapoo In dians, lately removed from the borders of Texas and Mexico to the Indiau Territory.

The bill to enable New Mexico be come a State was carried through the House to day. It will meet with much more opposition in the Senate, and will not be acted upon until the nest session.

A new Era for San Antonio.

San Antonio is one of the oldest cities on the North American con tinent. But few other places were settled by Europeans before this place was; and it is one among the two or three places thus early settled that have maintained their position as cities of continuous life and steady growth amid the mutations of over a century and a half San Augustine, Florida, Jamestown, Virginia, and other places of lease the murderers now in jail. early European settlement, have virtually ceased to be. Philadelphia. San Antonio, and some other places settled about the close of the seventeenth century, or beginning of the eighteenth, are yet looking forward to greater historical and commercial importance at the opening of the twentieth century. For about a hundred and sixty years San Anto nio has stood in the midst of her springs and streams, "beautiful for situation," but important mainly from historical associations and events, connected with the rule of foreign kings, and native presidents of the Latin-Indian race, and the westward march of Anglo-American cattle, because there are few to steal. civilization.

But the real history of San Antonio as a live, progressive, prosperous and great American city, is just now about to begin. She is soon to be connected by rail and this evening. He will try to pro steam with the railway system of the United States, and to become head. a living member of that yast body of trade and commerce whose nerves and veins and arteries are composed of a huge net-work of railway lines. The throbbing, bounding, invigoliving body will be forced out into country. this far-off extremity of San Antonio as soon as the railway trains come steaming and storming into our streets. The days of the old "San Antonio Road," the "King's High way," leading from the city of Mexico to San Antonio, through Texas, crossing the Tangipaho river in Louisiana at the present Amite city, 70 miles above New Orleans, and continuing round to San Augustine, the days of the historical old trace will be gone forever.

San Antonio has held her own. and slowly grown, through all Amer ican history. Now, she will grow rapidly. Like the century plant, she has for long years waited for the spring-time of her life, when she might suddenly break forth into efflorescence and beauty. That time is now close at hand. One railroad wiff reach and touch her with its vitalizing power before the close of this year. Another will reach her soon atter. Althers will follow with increasing rapidity, and she will soon be a railroad centre, with lines running to the North At lantic, the Middle Atlantic, the South Atlantic, the eastern Gulf coast, the southern Gulf coast, the western Gulf coast, and the southern and northern Pacific coast, She will soon be connected with every port of the whole coast line of the United States and of Mexico.

In view of the new and bright history of San Antonio just about to begin, every citizen interested in her future should become fully awake to the advantages offered them of making her a great and prosperous city. A wise and public spirited citizenship alone can make her what she ought to be. No city ever be comes great from mere natural advantages. The committee on organization of the colored Methodist Episcopal Church of America made a report, which was adopted, declaring that the organization of the colored church into district ec clesiastical conventions meets with the hearty approval of the conference, and that efforts to establish an institution of learning for the education of colored ministers deserves to be commanded to friends of the colored people everywhere.

St. Lcuis, May 22 .- Dr. J. Wilson, of Pittsburgh, was elected moderator of the Presbyterian Assembly.

CHICAGO, May 22 .- Professor Swing, who was acquitted of heresy by the Presbytary, has withdrawn from the Presbyterian

LONDON, May 22 .- A Paris dispatch to the standard says it is thought that the combinations made last night to complete the Ministry will be successful, and the new Cabinet will probably be promulgated with de Cosas, Audife or Parquiret as the head of the Bonapartists, and the legitimists will be excluded.

Paris, May 22.—The duel between Prince Metternich and the Count of Montebelle took place at Monden, bear Versailles. The Count was wounded in the arm and disabled.

LONDON, May 22.-The Telegraph's special from Paris asserts that Prince Metternich, not the Duke of Montebello, was slightly wounded in the duel between those two persons.

Special dispatches from Paris in relation to the Ministerial crisis are confused and contradictory.


