Letter from Houston.

HOUSTON, May 29. Editor San Antonio Express :

Our city has been the scene of lively excitement for the past week. It has been nothing but a vast pageant since the Fair began, amidst the shouts, the leagues of lights,

'And the roaring of the wheels" It seemed like a scene from the Arabian Nights instead of our usually quiet city. The Fair began under very invorable auspices. It was opened by Col. W. J. Hutchins, followed by Col. Ashbel Smith and Gov. Richard Coke. As I have not the time to give a detailed account of the Fair, I will just give some of its main features.

There were specimens of the geological formations, ot the flora of Texas, drugs, dry goods, curiosities of every description, a gallery of the fine arts, musical instruments; machinery, horned cattle and blooded stock, until it makes one's head diz

zy to think of them. But Thursday was the biggest day, there being about 18,000 people on the grounds at one time. General Beauregard reviewed the Washington Guards of Galveston and spoke to the people assembled, and was followed by Gen. De Bray, who made some very happy remarks. The Washington Guards gave a hop at the Hutchins House which pass ed off very pleasantly. There was also a reunion of the Alpha Club, a select society of the young ladies and gentlemen of Houston, at the residence of J. F. Cruger, which your correspondent attended. After dancing and promenading in the soft light of the moon until the small hours of the morning, the party broke up and went to their homes very much impressed with the kind hospitality of Mr. and Mrs. Cruger.

Our city is improving rapidly; we shall have street cars running from the Int. & G. N. R. R. depot to the H & T C R R depot, and from the City Hall to the Fair Grounds. We have two daily papers and three weekly papers, The Age, Telegraph, Baptist Herald, Star, & Signet. The Telegraph is fast becoming the leading daily in the city, under the management of A. C. Gray. It is the standard for news and intelligence all over the State.

"We have had quite an excitement over the charges of the Galveston Mercury against Capt. J. E. Whittlesey, Postmaster of this city. Capt. Whittlesey, as soon as the charges were made, asked for an investigation, which was made in presence of Special Agents Petherridge and Southworth and numerous other witnesses. As Capt. Whittlesey was entirely exhanorated, the Mercury changed its tactics, and accused Special Agents Petherridge and Southworth of being bribed with a basket of champague, whereas their repudation for hopesty and integri-ty is known all over the United States. The Future of Galveston.

We have long and disinterestedly watched the contest between Galveston and Houston for supremacy as commercial cities of Texas. We have at length become thoroughly convinced that the question is fully and finally decided in favor of Galveston. It is true that Houston has manifested, ever since this contest commenced, both before the war and since, a vast deal more plack and energy than Galveston, and has invested much more enterprise and money. But Galveston has had material advantages which, with all her lack of liberality and public spirit, has counterbalanced the efforts of Houston, and even made those efforts inure more to her own ad vantage than that of her rival. Houston has toiled to make herself the converging point of all the vast railroad lines which tap the various with their visitors. Mr. King, a mem sections of the vast territory of Texas, and of the other States whose trade will seek the sea through Texas; but all the immense trade of these long railroad lines is passing by Houston and going to the sea and to the shipping at Gal-

Houston made the mistake of investing her energy and money at the wrong places. Had she immediately after the war put out her whole strength for the accomplishment of two objects - railroad connection with New Orleans, and the completion of her ship channel-she would to-thy have been ahead of Galves ton. But she suffered the golden moment to pass by unimproved. The ship channel and the New Orleans railroad seem as far from re alization to-day as they did in 1866. And now, even should they be completed in the future, it is too late to realize the benefits from them which once might have been seenred. Travel, capital, the public interest of the whole country, now all pour into Galveston in an unbroken and ever-fuereasing tide. She will soon trave double the population of Houston, And she not only enjoys all the benefits of aft the railreads running to Houston, but the will soon have long railroad connection passing on each side of Hous-ton; and if her harbor improvements succeed, she will swallow up New Orleans as well as Houston

Even St. Louis is beginning to fear Galveston. The recent visit of the Kansas City delegation to Galveston, to promote the export of the vast grain products of the immense West through that port, has awak ened St. Louis to the tide that is likely to follow. The Democrat of that city calls attention to this movement, and urges that freight barges must be used on the Missis sippi, and that the necessary in provements at the mouth of that river must be made. The Democrat

If the products of the vast and tertile region west and northwest of us are to be moved by rail at all, they can, in truth, be moved to the Gulf at Galveston more economically than by any other route. From Omaha and all Nebraska, from Lea-Venworth, Kansas City, and all of Kansas, the Indian Territory and Southwest Missouri, farm products can be shipped by rail to that port, and thence by sea to Europe, more economically than they can be mov-ed by rail to the Atlantic ports, or to Chicago and thence by Lake and canal. Hence, capital will soon discover the advantages of the harbor of Galveston, and utilize them. Unless the natural water channels are developed and used, and the mouth of the Mississippi promptly opened, we may look to see a considerable diversion from Eastern routes to this yet undeveloped and still most promising seaport.

While listening to the discourse, my mind could butrecall gray hairs now laid in the grave, crowning the head of one whose cup of earthly joy would have been full to have seen this day, and whose heart went out in sympathy and earnest effort for the colored race; one who, in his humble sphere, by his prayers. speech, and labor, did much to has ten this day. Other pulpits in the city were filled by members of the conference, and the delegates were entertained by some of the prominent and wealthy families of the city. Taken all in all, it is a happy evidence that prejudice is giving way to right and reason; that men are more willing to accord justice to their fellow men, who are less fortunate as to complexion and tea ture, yet endowed by the same God with the same faculties.




