[COMMUNICATED.] The Captain's Carden.

In the spring of the year 1857 Capt. S. with his company was ordered to a Fort on the frontier of Texas. On arriving, the first thing done, was to make himself comfortable in the dilapidated quarters. Among other improvements, it was thought necessary by the officers long to have a company garden; and a place was selected on the bank of the river and tenced in for that purpose. Ferguson was appointed gar-dener. He understood his business and soon had the garden in a high state of cultivation. One morning the captain came to inspect the gar den and the following dialogue oc-

curred: Capt. "Ferguson! Why dou't you

go to planting ?" Fer.: "I am waiting for rain, sir." Capt.: "Don't you know that it hardly ever rains in this country !" Fer. "If that is the case, I cannot

raise anything bere." Capt.: "You have to raise vege-tables here by artificial means, with water from the river."

Fer.: "Under the circumstances, is impossible to do this; because the garden is too sloping and too high from the waterlevel."

Capt .: I will order a detail of men to bring all the water from the river you need."

Ferg.: "I cannot raise anything here, if the whole company had to

carry water; you had better try somebody else for a gardener."

By this time the captain's patience was exhausted; he stamped the ground and shouted: "You shall raise vegetables; I will make you grow vegetables here."

He went away a few steps, then turned around and said: "Plant melon and pumpkin seed at proper distances, and have a trench dug around them about two feet in diameter and 6 inches deep." Fergu son, although a recruit, knewenough of red tape to obey orders without any further argument, and soon had everything ready. In the evening a detail of about 25 men with buckets came to the garden and filled those trenches with water from the river; and the next morning the earth was put back in the trenches. earth was put back in the trenches. This was repeated every day, and in about a week the seeds spronted finely. But the summer heat was so severe that the splashing of the water on the ground caused the water on the ground caused the surface of the farden to become very hard and cloudy. The Captain was proud prer his success on seeing the vines growing, when the grass in the prairie was parched. In a month the vines got to be about a foot long, the leaves about one fourth of their natural size, with blossoms and fittle melons on. Then the vines became infested with small vermin, which made those lilliputran productions look still smaller.
The Captain got disgusted at the sight of such a crop; he took all the men which could be spared from the post and went on a scout. 'I don't know it it was the climate, water, soil, or the curses of the soldiers, who had to water the garden, that caused nature to produce such a freak. The garden was considered

breaking the clods, which the tramping on the wet ground had produced. One night in the mouth of July a refreshing rain soaked the earth, the crippled plants took a new start to growing, and in three weeks the garden was covered with luxurious melon and pumpkin vines, which produced a heavy crop that season. 


